## Maundy Thursday





In the UK, a public ceremony known as Maundy Thursday is held annually on the Thursday before Easter and the monarch distributes specially minted coins to the people.

Maundy money refers to the coins given to elderly during a ceremony that draws inspiration from Jesus Christ and the commandment he gave after washing the feet of his disciples.

The commandment, or mandatum, "that ye love one another" (John XIII 34) led to monarchs washing the feet of the poor and handing out gifts of food and clothing by the fourth century.

The Maundy ceremony as we know it today first took place during the reign of Charles II when the king gave people undated, hand-hammered coins in 1662. The traditional coins are a four penny, three penny, two penny, and one penny piece all held in a red purse. From 1670, these coins were dated and they have seen little change since. Today, the Royal Maundy Ceremony takes place annually on Maundy Thursday and there are as many recipients of these special coins as the sovereign's age.







