
what to know


what to know

what we are learning

In the month of May we will work on measuring in inches and feet. Students will become professionals when it comes to measuring things and comparing measurements. We will also work on reading a clock, reading time on the hour, quarter past, half past and quarter til. During our phonics students will work to review many of the things we have learned throughout the year such as short and long vowels, consonant clusters and words with double consonants. Folk Tales, Fairy Tales and Fables will be our reading focus. Students will be able to identify and compare genres as well as find the central message, moral or lesson in the books we read.

what we are learning

Math- We are finishing up our Fractions Model and focusing on how to multiply fractions by a whole number. We will continue working with fractions in word problems by adding/subtracting, comparing and renaming fractions. To wrap up our final module, we will focus on relating fractions to decimals up to the hundredths place. We will also continue to review/revisit previously learned math skills. Reading/Language- This month we will complete our novel study on the book Hoot by Carl Hiassen. We will continue story mapping with literary texts and also focus on developing the main idea and supporting details of informational texts. Writing- This month we will focus on poetry writing! Students will learn how to write a variety of poems and review figurative language. PBL- This month we will focus on Creepy Crawlers! We will also revisit Science and Social Standards topics previously
