



I have been sewing since I was a young girl. I was in 4-H and won a blue ribbon on my dress, at my very first sewing competition,

when I was 9 tears old. I continued sewing all through school. I graduated from Texas Tech University with a degree in Home Economics. While at Tech, I worked as a costume designer and seamstress in the theater arts department. I later made my wedding gown and then continued to sew for my family over the years. I began quilting in 2006-2007 and haven't stopped since!

In 2011, we moved from Texarkana, Texas to this area. In 2014 we purchased the Red Barn Retreat and have been hosting quilting and scrapbooking retreats since then.

Last year we opened Lala's quilt shop on September 6, 2023, in Coldspring. We are excited to be taking on this new adventure! We carry a wide variety of fabrics, including, Moda, Ruby Star Society, Bella Solids, Grunge, Free Spirit including Tula Pink and Kaffe Fasset, and Shadow Play. We also have a wonderful line of Batik Textiles fabrics as well as many others. There is a variety of thread, notions, books and patterns, and machine embroidery supplies as well.

We are a Janome authorized dealer.

Mark is currently able to clean and service sewing machines and will soon be an authorized Janome service technician.

I also have a computerized Innova longarm and provide edge 2 edge quilting services.

We are planning to start offering classes, including a beginner quilting class and classes for various other quilting techniques starting in the Spring. I am a Certified Teacher of Shannon Brinkley's Scrappy Applique and Color Confidence for Quilters programs. LaLa's will be planning classes for both programs, as well as English Paper Piecing, 2 Fabric Bargello, and others. The classes will be held at the Red Barn Retreat. Also, be on the lookout for some fun Block of the Month programs coming later this year.



Rodeo is a sport that grew out of the cattle industry in the American West. Its roots reach back to the sixteenth century. The Spanish conquistadors and Spanish-Mexican settlers played a key role in the origin of rodeo with the introduction and propagation of horses and cattle in the Southwest. It was originally based on the skills required of the working vaqueros and later, cowboys, in what today is the western United States, western Canada, and northern Mexico. Today, it is a sporting event that involves horses and other livestock, designed to test the skill and speed of the cowboys and cowgirls.

American-style professional rodeos generally comprise the following events: tie-down roping, team roping, steer wrestling, saddle bronc riding, bareback bronc riding, bull riding and barrel racing. The events are divided into two basic categories: the rough stock events and the timed events. Depending on sanctioning organization and region, other events such as breakaway roping, goat tying, and pole bending may also be a part of some rodeos. The "world's first public cowboy contest" was held on July 4, 1883, in Pecos, Texas, between cattle driver Trav Windham and roper Morg Livingston.

In the United States, professional rodeos are governed and sanctioned by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA) and Women's Professional Rodeo Association (WPRA), while other associations govern assorted children's, high school, collegiate, and other amateur or semi-professional rodeos. The traditional season for competitive rodeo runs from spring through fall, while the modern professional rodeo circuit runs longer, and concludes with the PRCA National Finals Rodeo (NFR) in Las Vegas, Nevada, currently held every December.[3]

In January 1932, Sartwelle invited six other businessmen to a lunch at the Texas State Hotel. They decided to host a livestock exposition in Houston. Sartwelle was named the first president of the new Houston Fat Stock Show. Their inaugural event was held in late April 1932 at Sam Houston Hall in downtown Houston. It's become bigger and better every year. Rodeo season starts in Texas in January at the Ft. Worth stock yards and is now in San Antonio and will be in Houston on February 28 - March 18th.
