I personally picked up a few new goodies and saw several others that I plan to get in the near future.





Unfinished Size: 9-1/2" x 12-1/2"

Cutting Instructions:



A — Cut 2 — 3-1/2" squares


B — Cut 2 — 2" x 4-1/4" rectangles

C — Cut 6 — 2" squares




D - Cut 2 - 4-1/4" x 5" rectangles

E — Cut 1 — 2" x 6-1/2" rectangles




F — Cut 6 — 3-1/2" squares





Press seams as indicated by arrows

OUTER TULIP PETAL UNIT





- ☐ Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric C squares.
- ☐ With the right sides together, layer a Fabric C square on the top right corner of a Fabric F square.
- Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam.
- ☐ Outer Tulip Petal Unit should measure 3-1/2" x 3-1/2".
- ☐ Make four.

CENTER TULIP PETAL UNIT






- ☐ With right sides facing, layer a Fabric C square on the top left corner of a Fabric F square.
- ☐ Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam.







- ☐ Repeat on the top right corner.
- ☐ Center Tulip Petal Unit should measure 3-1/2" x 3-1/2".
- Make one.

ASSEMBLE the TOP PATCHWORK TULIP UNIT:









- ☐ The Top Patchwork Tulip Unit should measure 6-1/2" x 9-1/2".

LEFT LEAF UNIT



- ☐ Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric A squares.
- ☐ With right sides facing, layer a Fabric A square on the top right corner of a Fabric D rectangle.
- \square Sitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam.
- ☐ Left Leaf Unit should measure 4-1/4" x 5".
- ☐ Make one.


RIGHT LEAF UNIT






- □ With right sides facing, layer a Fabric A square on the top left corner of a Fabric D rectangle.
- ☐ Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam.

ASSEMBLE the BOTTOM PATCHWORK TULIP UNIT








- ☐ The Bottom Patchwork Tulip Units should measure 6-1/2" x 9-1/2".
