

QUILTS OF HONOR

GUIDELINES

Construction of Quilts of Honor:

- Fabric of 100% high quality, appropriate for adults
- Patriotic Theme (not necessarily Red/White/Blue)
- ☆ Large enough in size to cover an average-sized adult,
 - \Rightarrow ideally 60" x 80";
 - \Rightarrow not smaller than 55" x 65" and
 - ☆ not larger than 72" x 90"
 - unless previously approved by the QoH
 Chairperson. At times we realize lap
 quilts for wheelchair veterans are
 sometimes preferred and/or requested
- 🙀 No tied quilts
- ☆ Low loft batting is preferred
- 🙀 Quilting that is not overly dense
- Binding constructed with diagonal seams, double fold, attached by machine; either finished by hand or machine
- All QoH should be pre-washed with Color Catchers

FORMS:

- QoH request forms will be available at guild meetings
- QoH Request Forms can be located on the Guild Website at: <u>http://www.lpqgtexas.org</u> under the drop down menu "Activities & Information" under Quilts of Honor
- One QoH Request per Veteran must be completed and returned to Bonnie Walker as soon as possible.
- All QoH Request Forms should be received by September 15th

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Livingston Piecemakers Quilt Guild

May 9, 2022 – Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by President **Jammie Ackley**. The opening prayer was given by **Patty Drewett**. The minutes of the April meeting as printed in the newsletter were approved. The March Treasurer's Report as printed in the April newsletter was approved following a motion and second.

Jammie asked for member suggestions for future program presenters that would fit our Guild's budget.

TREASURER – DONNA GARLAND – if anyone would like a printed copy of the proposed budget presented last month, send **Donna** a request. April started with a balance of \$12,526.29 with income of \$470.00 and expenditures of \$95.00 resulting in net income of \$375.00 and an ending balance of \$12,901.29 on April 30. A reminder to Committee Chairs to notify Donna of any donations not turned in for reimbursement so that she can make offsetting transactions to assist in budget planning next year.

Mary Kirk gave two tickets to **LyLa Wenneker** that she won from Scenic Loop VFD for a fish fry/crawfish boil that she was unable to use.

BUY/SELL/TRADE TABLE – MARY PARRISH - some freebies for taking, and a few items for sale.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH – SHARON JEANS there were 20 blocks turned in which were won by Marci Dickens.

<u>COMMUNITY SERVICE – MEG RYBICKI</u> – there were 5 pillowcases and 1 walker bag turned in. The

focus remains on children's novelty fabric pillowcases which will run until August.

BOARD MEETING Minutes
