- Debbie Cox's Dad received great news regarding the cancer diagnosis. His surgery was a success with no indication that it spread.





QUILTS OF HONOR

GUIDELINES

Construction of Quilts of Honor:

- Fabric of 100% high quality, appropriate for adults
- ☆ Patriotic Theme (not necessarily Red/White/Blue)
- Large enough in size to cover an average-sized adult,
 - ☆ ideally 60" x 80";
 - not smaller than 55" x 65" and
 - ☆ not larger than 72" x 90"
 - unless previously approved by the QoH Chairperson. At times we realize lap quilts for wheelchair veterans are sometimes preferred and/or requested
- ☆ No tied quilts
- ☆ Low loft batting is preferred
- Quilting that is not overly dense
- Binding constructed with diagonal seams, double fold, attached by machine; either finished by hand or machine
- All QoH should be pre-washed with Color Catchers

FORMS:

- QoH request forms will be available at guild meetings
- QoH Request Forms can be located on the Guild Website at: http://www.lpqgtexas.org under the drop down menu "Activities & Information" under Quilts of Honor
- One QoH Request per Veteran must be completed and returned to Bonnie Walker as soon as possible.
- All QoH Request Forms should be received by September 15th

The meeting was called to order at 9:35 a.m. by President **Jammie Ackley**. The opening prayer was given by **Bonnie Walker**. The minutes of the May meeting as printed in the newsletter were approved. One correction was reported that the October retreat at the Boehm house is \$350 NOT \$315 – however this was not a part of the minutes. April Treasurer's Report as printed in the May newsletter was approved following a motion and second.

IST VP/PROGRAMS - KAREN GODFREY --

has been trying to find speaker. One person replied she has a program "Zen Quilting" and her cost is \$450 for half a day and 750 for a full day. She drives from Fredericksburg so would expect mileage, meals, and motel. One speaker like this would use our entire budget. **Holiday party** - would the Guild like to do as last year and have a gift exchange as well as a handmade ornament exchange? Do they want to have just the ornament, just the gift, or alternate each year? Voting next month to decide.

Flower Power presented by Karen Godfrey. Using the book by Komoko Sudo – Folded Flowers: Fabric Origami with a Twist of Silk Ribbon, along with a free project flyer from Hobby Lobby, Karen showed how to make several different fabric flowers. Clover products make a template for one type of flower. She had all of the pieces and patterns cut out and ready to begin sewing. She covered the Yo-Yo, Ruffled Flower, Scalloped Flower on felt, a spiral flower and round flower. It kept everyone busy and the pages of instructions will be invaluable.

LOCAL QUILT SHOP NEWS — LaDonyce

Hamilton and her husband have purchased Jean's Corner Quilt Shop which is now LaLa's Quilt Shop. Their hours are Wednesday 1:00pm-4:30pm, Thursday and Friday 10:00am-4:30pm, and Saturday 10:00am-3:00pm. She will offer a 10% discount to Guild members, and is currently having specials such as 25% off fabrics with 1- yard minimum cuts along with other items. They are currently waiting on shipments of Janome sewing machines, and her husband will attend training in New Jersey to become an accredited service man.

TREASURER – DONNA GARLAND — May started with a balance of \$12,526.29 with income of \$243.00 and expenditures of \$226.00 resulting in net income of \$16.45 and an ending balance of \$12,917.74 on May 31.

Fabrics can be pulled from your stash or can be a reason to go shopping. Do we really need a 'reason' to go shopping? Approximately 37 Fat Quarters, background, setting triangle fabric and a border will be needed.






