QUILTS OF HONOR

GUIDELINES

Construction of Quilts of Honor:

- Fabric of 100% high quality, appropriate for adults
- ☆ Patriotic Theme (not necessarily Red/White/Blue)
- Large enough in size to cover an average-sized adult.
 - ☆ ideally 60" x 80";
 - not smaller than 55" x 65" and
 - ☆ not larger than 72" x 90"
 - unless previously approved by the QoH Chairperson. At times we realize lap quilts for wheelchair veterans are sometimes preferred and/or requested
- ☆ No tied quilts
- ☆ Low loft batting is preferred
- Quilting that is not overly dense
- Binding constructed with diagonal seams, double fold, attached by machine; either finished by hand or machine
- All QoH should be pre-washed with Color Catchers

FORMS:

- QoH request forms will be available at guild meetings
- QoH Request Forms can be located on the Guild Website at: http://www.lpqgtexas.org under the drop down menu "Activities & Information" under Quilts of Honor
- One QoH Request per Veteran must be completed and returned to Bonnie Walker as soon as possible.
- All QoH Request Forms should be received by September 15th



The meeting was opened at 9:30am by President Jammie Ackley. The opening prayer was given by Vickie Myers.

The minutes for June as printed in the newsletter were approved after motion by Donna Garland and seconded by Patty Drewett. The May Treasurer's Report as printed in the June newsletter was approved following motion by Sondra Sterling and a second by Karen Godfrey.

TREASURER - DONNA GARLAND — The current Treasurer's report for June has a beginning balance of \$12,947.74 with inflow of \$554.00 and outflow of \$134.95 for an ending balance of \$13,366.76 on June 30. There is a \$30 difference due to a check never being presented, so it was voided.

1ST VP/PROGRAMS - KAREN GODFREY -

Karen Godfrey gave a rundown of the next few months. In August we will learn what judges look for when they are judging quilts. September is our Challenge month. October will have Roberta Norris Burton giving a program on marbleizing fabrics, while November is our Quilt of Honor presentation. December will be our annual Holiday Party with both a gift between \$20 and \$25 and a handmade ornament exchange.

UFO CHALLENGE for AUGUST is #4

Our program was a YouTube Video presentation of Tania Tanti and painting quilts. She starts with a rough sketch, then adds her colors. Her fabric is heavier than regular quilting fabrics. When quilting she sometimes uses double threads. On FB you can watch her again if you missed any of it. Tana Mueller does a coloring with crayons on

fabric on a YouTube Video, while there is a teacher in Huntsville, Helen Belcher who teaches a class on coloring quilts – mostly wall hangings 75cm x 100cm.

Our September Challenge must be at least 24" x 24" and quilted.

<u>LIBRARIAN - LYLA WENNEKER</u> — Library books are in back, \$3 for soft covers and \$5 for hard cover books. There are scrapbooks on display. Look through them, Kay Hardy is going to "house" them.

DUES – if not paid by August 1 you will be dropped from the roll.

MEMBERSHIP – GAIL KESTLER – There are 32 members present and 4 guests. Members logged 306 volunteer hours, and 14 members attended Bees.

There is a need for name tags, the pattern is on the web.

If a member of our Guild lives in a county, the Guild can donate to charities in that county. This was discussed by the Board several months ago.





How it works:

- ▶ For four months you will receive instructions for four 15-1/2" blocks and ten 5-1/2" blocks
- ▶ For one month you will receive instructions for twenty-four 4-1/2" blocks
- In December, we will take a break
- For one month you will receive instructions for one 18-1/2" block and top construction
- For month #7 you will receive the original pattern and \$ jars will be drawn for

When you pay your \$'s you will receive your Fabric Requirements. \$10 from each participant \$'s will be put in Jar's for the 7th month drawing.

Fabrics can be pulled from your stash or can be a reason to go shopping. Do we really need a 'reason' to go shopping? Approximately 37 Fat Quarters, background, setting triangle fabric and a border will be needed.

Starting in July, each participant will receive the instructions for that month's homework. Each month that the homework is completed you will get a chance to win a jar of \$'s. At the 7th month each one will reveal their completed top (if you completed it) and drawings for the winning of the \$ jar/jars.

The pattern comes from a great spiral bound booklet. There are four other projects that accompany the booklet. You will have a tag along to see and have the additional patterns.






