Our guest speaker Gail Rowland talked about the judging process. She gave us many things a judge looks for in judging a quilt such as visual impact and color, piecing (sharp points, matching points, and thread colors that blend), good workmanship, the quilting, binding an edge treatments, quilt back (should be straight and square), quilt ready (clean, no lint or pet hairs) and lastly should hang well.

Maybe you've had some of these reactions to entering a judged quilt show "Nah! My quilts aren't good enough to be used in a quilt show" or "I don't want my clothes hanging next to works of art!" Or "I don't want everyone to see my mistakes!" If so here are a few reasons to enter a judged quilt show:

- 1) It may motivate you to complete projects.
- 2) It makes you take your work more seriously. If it's for a show you will fix that sloppy seam or crooked corner and you're happier with your work.
- 3) All quilts are beautiful.
- 4) You see your work in a different perspective.
- 5) This is a celebration of quilting. Revel with others who enjoy quilting.
- 6) It's all about good old fashion fun.

Lastly, you're going to get feed back from the judges that will help you improve your quilting. Be a part of encouraging the creativity of others and fostering the love of quilting at every opportunity. Enter a quilt for judging!

Things coming up:

August 29th is our fifth Monday workshop. Norma Christiansen will be showing us how to make the Itty Bitty Bag. The cost is seven dollars. If you have not signed up and wish to, contact Norma.

September is our challenge. The object is to create a quilt design at least 24×24 that makes the viewer laugh out loud, giggle a little or at least smile. The only stipulation is you have to keep it clean. For those participating in this challenge bring your quilt in a brown paper bag. Please cover your labels.

October we will have a guest speaker Roberta Burton on Marbleizing fabric.

- Complete Kit Pattern, Fabric, Backing, Binding and you are asked to provide the batting and quilt it.
- 2. **Precut Top Only Quilt Kit** Precut blocks, Sashing, and Border provided
- 3. **Precut Block Kit with Sashing** no border, batting, backing, or binding included

GUILDELINES:

- Kits are signed for and checkout at guild meetings.
- Please plan to complete your quilt kit within 60 days and return at the next guild meeting.
- If you are unable to finish your quilt kit, please return so that another person will be able to complete the kit.







WALKER BAG Designed by Norma Christensen

FABRIC: 36" x 18", either <u>prequilted fabric</u> or quilt the fabric.

Add binding all the way around.

Add **HOOK & LOOP** and **TIES** where indicated. This will be to the inside of the bag.

When attaching the Hook&Loop, please make sure it matches up after the bag is folded and stitched.


Add the ties when stitching the sides together placing the ties at 1" above the fold in the pocket.



QUILTS OF HONOR

GUIDELINES

Construction of Quilts of Honor:

- Fabric of 100% high quality, appropriate for adults
- Patriotic Theme (not necessarily Red/White/Blue)
- Large enough in size to cover an average-sized adult,
 - ☆ ideally 60" x 80";
 - not smaller than 55" x 65" and
 - not larger than 72" x 90"
 - unless previously approved by the QoH Chairperson. At times we realize lap quilts for wheelchair veterans are sometimes preferred and/or requested
- ☆ No tied quilts
- Low loft batting is preferred
- Quilting that is not overly dense
- Binding constructed with diagonal seams, double fold, attached by machine; either finished by hand or machine
- All QoH should be pre-washed with Color Catchers

FORMS:

- QoH request forms will be available at guild meetings
- QoH Request Forms can be located on the Guild Website at: http://www.lpqgtexas.org under the drop down menu "Activities & Information" under Quilts of Honor
- One QoH Request per Veteran must be completed and returned to Bonnie Walker as soon as possible.
- ☆ All QoH Request Forms should be received no later than OCTOBER 10th



QOH workshops at The Red Barn Retreat are scheduled for Monday, September 19th and October 17th to work on your quilts in preparation for the guild presentation on Monday, November 14th. We bring our lunch and contribute \$10 for the facility use.

History of Civil War

The American Civil War began in April 1861 and was concluded by April 1865.

The dramatic growth of the British textile industry in the early 19th century fueled the demand for cotton which soon became the leading US export commodity. Annual domestic cloth production in the decade from 1846 to 1856 grew from 13.5 million to 97 million yards of fabric. American merchants imported an additional \$17 million worth of printed and dyed cloth in 1854. The selection must have been overwhelming!

Fabrics of the civil war era: dyed colors of Indigo blue, shades of reds plus dull lavenders and many browns. Many style prints such as geometrics and florals plus plaids, plaids and more plaids.

Hope you enjoyed this history lesson on civil war fabrics, I know I did.



August Block of the Month Winner 'A Magic Block Show"

The meeting was called to order at 9:50 a.m. by President Jammie Ackley. The opening prayer was offered by Bonnie Magid.

There were no corrections to the July minutes as printed in the newsletter, and after a motion by Kay Hardy and a second by Jeanie Noble they were accepted. The Treasurer's report for June as published in the July newsletter was accepted following motion by Karen Godfrey and, a second by LyLa Wenneker.

1ST VP/PROGRAMS – KAREN GODFREY – Karen gave a rundown of next few months. September is our Challenge "Make Me Laugh" with entries being quilted and at least 24" x24". Norma Christensen will also go over new Community Service items. October will be a lecture on marbleizing, while November is our Quilt of Honor presentation. The year rounds out with our annual Holiday party.

Karen Godfrey introduced our speaker, Gail Rowland, who told us "What Makes Award Winning Quilts" or "What Quilt Judges Look Gail shared that she began piecing quilts in the late 90s and her first small quilt was a Double Wedding Ring. Twenty years ago, she bought her long-arm quilting machine and she was in business. The Woodlands Area Quilt Guild had a "judged show" in 2014 and she had an opportunity to assist in the judging room where she learned a lot. Your quilt doesn't need to have a WOW factor with tons of color...but it can. Value and contrast are very important along with precision of your piecing. The thread should be an appropriate color and stitch length so that stitches are almost invisible. Watch for dark seam shadowing through and grade your

seams if necessary. Curves should be smooth with no points. Embellishments to enhance the quilt need to be securely attached. Stitch in the ditch should remain in the ditch. Your quilting should be balanced across the quilt and avoid stitch buildup front and back. Make sure that your tension is balanced front and back. Pantographs need to interlock properly, while borders and sashing need to complement the guilt. If using plaids, stripes or checks make sure they meet in the corners. Leave 1/8" of batting to fill your binding completely. Check online for a binding technique if having trouble, but stitch corners shut both front and back. Binding cut on the bias lasts longer and wears better, and the back binding doesn't need to be the same size as the front. If you email have questions Gail at gail4quilts@yahoo.com.






