LPQG | 9 OCTOBER 2023 Meeting Minutes

Meeting was Called to Order at 9:33 by Bonnie Walker who thanked all for coming today. She welcomed all as well as visitors to the meeting and requested phones to be silenced.

Patty Drewett then opened the meeting with prayer.

Bonnie Walker opened the floor for any correction to the minutes from last month's quilt guild meeting. Donna Garland motioned to accept last month's minutes, and Marci Dickens seconded the motion.

Bonnie Magid motioned to accept financial minutes as printed in newsletter, and Jammie Ackley seconded the motion.

VICE PRESIDENT - MARCI DICKENS - Marci made a few announcements -

Next month there will be binding sessions in the various rooms of which some of our guild members will show how to do this. December is Christmas and holiday celebration for the guild and to bring a handmade wrapped ornament for an exchange as well as a sewing related wrapped item \$20 or so that you'd enjoy getting.

- We will also have an ugly sweater contest, so be ready to have a little fun with that.
- December is also when we reveal secret sisters.
- January will be baby shower for Grace Pregnancy Center, so bring anything you'd need to get for a new mom or things you'd take for a baby shower
- March is the anniversary for our guild and we'll have a celebration.
- 5th Mon. is Oct. 30th and we will work on pillowcases that we use to give Quilts of Valor away, so bring your machines. The location is here at Blanchard Baptist Church from 9am to 3pm and bring your lunch.

Marci then presented our speaker, Jammie Ackley. Jammie provided information about The Quilting Escape – Studio 180 and explained how she got accepted to learn and get certified to be an instructor. She explained the process of classes and how piecing has drastically changed with Studio 180. Tools in the bag associated with Studio 180 were displayed and organized by alphabetized files for all to see. Jammie explained how Studio 180 is for the realist not idealist designed by Deb Tucker and provided a handout explaining the tools available for order in the toolbox along with specifics of what and how they can be used. Accuracy and precision were key points shared as a result of using these tools. The idea of units per blocks was shared, and numerous tools and sizing were explained of which most have 6 sizes within one tool. Jammie then shared how these tools have multiple size usage. YouTube videos are also available for the tools to see a step by step of how to use them. She then displayed some of the tools and how to utilize the instructions of the tools as well as how to access and print them 8 ½ x 11 from the online website. A binder of 75 blockbuster blocks that are free to help utilize the tools were also on display of which most have 3 sizes to use. Tech sheets and block samples were explained, displayed and passed around for viewing. Beautiful quilts were displayed that utilized the units used with these tools such as the following:

- Wedged star tool used 8 wedges sewn into the block and then put together.
- A Block 9 Blockbuster table runner was displayed of the V block and 4 quarter squared triangles.
- Off set half square triangle was explained and displayed in a quilt of how a pattern was tested and critiqued.
- With the Rapid Fire LeMoyne Star traditional block tool table runners and a quilt were displayed.
- A quilt was also displayed that utilized the Hunter Star.
- Companion triangles on diamonds were explained and how one unit can be learned to put a whole quilt together. Units help construction to not be so intimidating.

Many beautiful quilts, bed runners, and table runners were displayed in addition to how using the tools were helpful in their creation. Next, Jamie involved volunteers in playing a game of constructing blocks with units. Prizes of needle sets were awarded to the winners. Marci Dickens announced a 15 min. break at 10:40am.

The meeting was called back to order by Bonnie Walker at 10:54 am, and reminded everyone that the doors are locked while we are in the meeting.

MEMBERSHIP – SHARON WRIGHT – Sharon reported the following:

- 45 members were at the guild meeting.
- Karen Ogg and Allie Parrish were announced as visitors.
- 577 volunteer hours reported at today's meeting and 28 Bee attendees.

Door prize winners were Lyla Wenneker, Kathy O'Tierney, Donna Garland, Mary Parrish, and Vicki Wooddell.

TREASURERS REPORT – PATTY DREWETT – Patty provided the following information of the treasury report:

BLOCK OF THE MONTH – SHARON JEANS – Sharon displayed the quilt blocks turned in, and two people were in the running for the drawing. Congratulations Donna Garland on winning the seventeen blocks. The block for next month is a sewing spool pattern to be made with Batik material.

FAT QUARTER OF THE MONTH – GINGER SEBASTIAN –We had 16 fat quarters of Scare your Crow turned in. A drawing of 7 eligible members took place and Marti Hubbard won. Congratulations Marti! Next month's fat quarter theme is Sew Much Fun, so bring a fat quarter with sewing notions or anything sewing on it

EXCHANGE TABLE – MARY PARRISH – Mary reported that at the exchange table, many items and material were donated for sale including bolted material. Bitsy Barr explained and displayed fabric that is available for sale. Joyce Trojan announced the logo items for sale.

LIBRARIAN – KAREN LANTRON – Sheila Robertson shared information on the books and materials available for sale from the library.

F.A.I.T.H – **LISA JEFFERIES** – Sharon Jeffries announced that four people brought in goodies today including crocheted caps, candies, and toiletries. A packing session will take place Thursday at 5:30 at the physical therapy location and November 9th at 5:30 will be the following packing meeting.

HOSPITALITY – KATHIE HILTON – Kathie thanked all those who provided refreshments for the hospitality and announced that there are leaflets to take as a reminder for those who'd like to volunteer to bring snacks or drinks to next month's guild meeting.

SPECIAL PROJECTS – **KAREN GODFREY** –Karen displayed Wish as the book to make a mini quilt for. Glenda Henson made a quilt for the Penguin Who Wanted to be Different and Sarah Bourne made one for Birds of a Feather Flock together. A mini quilt was made for the book, I Just Wanted to Say Goodnight by Glenda Henson.

COMMUNITY SERVICE – NORMA CHRISTENSEN - Sarah Bourne announced items that came in for donations of community service as follows: 78 placemats; 53 burp cloths; 10 stockings; 90 heart pillows; 8 bears; 2 squares / quilt tops; and 1 pillowcase.

An announcement was made to please bring grocery bags to Bitsy Barr. Bonnie Walker explained how bags are crocheted for mats that go for homeless people in Nacogdoches, New Orleans and around the world that Bitsy organizes. Bitsy announced that she would be back in December and provide a workshop after the meeting of how to make mats out of grocery bags.

50/50 RAFFLE, BIRTHDAY, VISITORS – VICKIE MYERS – Vickie drew for the 50/50 raffle and Jammie Ackley was the winner of \$17.00. Vickie also brought the basket of fat quarters for members with October birthdays. Members with October birthdays came forward and selected a fat quarter of their choice.

DONATION QUILT – MADI MCMURRAY - Bonnie Walker announced that our quilt will go out on October 17th. Madi announced that she has tickets for the quilt and each member will need to sell \$25 of tickets. She will have tickets to pass out to members at the next meeting.

QUILT SCHEDULER – DONNA GARLAND – Donna has information on the quilt schedule. We have an opportunity to sell tickets at Escapees for the quilt at their Fall Festival and need 6 volunteers for 2-hour shifts so she can call them with information if needed.

- Sue Glick will take the quilt to the Peace by Piecing Quilt Guild in Humble on October 17th.
- In November, Destiny Pennington is taking the quilt to Bay Area Quilt Guild located in Houston.
- In December, Karen Godfrey and Jammie Ackley will take the quilt to Tall Pines Quilt Guild in Huntsville.
- In February of 2024, Lyla Wenneker is taking the quilt to Tri County Quilt guild in Cypress.

Donna will be scheduling more places so if anyone knows of an event to take it to, please let her know.

BEES - LaDonyce Hamilton announced that there will be a quilting bee in Coldspring tomorrow 10-4 at the Red Barn Quilt Retreat and is come and go and bring a lunch. This is for working on Quilts for Kids at the Red Barn. Quilts go to children of birth to age 22. A quilt was displayed by Karen Lee that was created at a bee.

SUNSHINE AND SHADOWS – SHARON JEFFERIES –Sharon announced that cards were sent to Norma Christensen, Lois Ross, Susan Bell, and Karen and Dave Godfrey. Sharon announced that BobbieLee Ruskis would be sent a card.

STASH BUILDER – GAIL KESTLER – Patty Lawson announced that 3 drawings would be conducted and the winners were Karen Ogg, Karen Lee and Kay Hardy.

HOMETOWN CHRISTMAS – KATHIE HILTON – Hometown Christmas is Saturday December 9. The guild will have a booth to sell items from noon to 8pm.

We will have quilts to sell and will need volunteers to sell tickets and items at the booth. Sometimes people will shop at the booth and inquire about the quilts, patterns, and quilting as they admire items displayed for sale. Kathie will be asking people to contribute quilts for sale. Mark the date as she will organize volunteers for the booth.

QUILTS OF VALOR – BONNIE WALKER – Bonnie displayed a quilt created by Darlene Hays who donated a quilt for Quilt of Valor. More quilts are needed. A quilt was displayed created by Bonnie Walker made in red, white, and blue grunge with an Accucutter. Pillowcases were also displayed with instructions provided for members who'd like to pick these up and make some. Bonnie will have the pillowcases cut out and ready to make with the hotdog method. A 9am-3pm class will be provided on Oct. 30th. Due to the death of a recipient a quilt will be presented to his wife. Nov. 11, 2024 is the date due for Quilts of Valor.

OTHER BUSINESS - A request came through the website inquiring if there is a bus to go to the Houston Quilt Show. Quilters Quarters was mentioned as to possibly have busses going. Bonnie Walker asked if there was any unfinished business. Kay Hardy requested input for an article for the guild's anniversary event so she can help with the publicity. - Jammie Ackley displayed a pumpkin table runner, Boo Wall Hanging (for a drawing won by Teresa Richard), and a Center for Mystery Star in January. She announced to let her know if anyone wants to be a part of the Mystery Star so she can order booklets
- Patty Drewett showed a pattern that she made a purse and wallet from.
- Melanie Fredrickson displayed a quilted Halloween panel. She explained how she did outline stitching, added specialty items, and how she added the backing added specialty items, and how she added the backing segments for the rod for hanging.
- Glenda Henson showed a quilt made with a historical reference of Bourgoyne's Surround, an 1812 battle. She also displayed a temperature quilt created from last year's highs and lows of each day. Each line represents a month. Glenda also showed how she included the temperature key on the quilt backing. A mini quilt with Halloween décor and fall table runner were also shown.
- Bonnie Walker explained that fabric is donated as well as patterns when working on Quilts for Kids. She displayed a beautiful quilt made with cats on it. Another quilt was made with purple scraps that turned out beautiful and reminded us that kids and retirement home residents enjoy the color.
- Sharon Jeans showed a quilt entitled "Owl Always Love You" from a Riley Blake pattern with a flange binding. She displayed the owl on the front and backing that is also at LaDonna's.


Reports – Chairs get a segment to Vicki Wooddell to include in a newsletter.


Livingston Piece Makers Quilt Guild Block of the Month Oct. return in Nov.

This Block is from the Book "Stashtastic" by Doug Leko

2 61/2"

Make one 61/2" × 71/2".

Sew white $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $7\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to the left and right sides of a segment from step 1. Make one unit. measuring $7\frac{1}{2}$ " × $8\frac{1}{2}$ ", including seam allowances.




Make 48 units, 7½" × 8½".

3 Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the white 1½" squares. Place marked squares on the upper-left and upper-right corners of a black strip. Sew on the marked lines. Trim the excess corner fabric ½" from the stitched lines. Make httck measuring 2" × 8½", including seam allowances.









- 1. 3-6 colors of Batiks your choice
- Cut one strip each (1 ½) (1 ")
 And (2') inches
- * using the strips .sew the long Sides together . sub cut these. Into $7 \frac{1}{2} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ blocks
- 3. White Fabric Cut(4) 1/2 Squres
 Cut (1) 1 ½ x WOF 1/2 X 1/2
 Sub cut these into (2) 10 ½ (2)
 7 ½ strips
- 4. Black fabric cut (2) 2"x 8 1/2"

Join one unit from step 2 and two units from step 3 to make a column. Sew white $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × $10\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to the left and right sides of the column.





Make 48 blocks, 10½" × 10½".

Note: you might have to add one strip

To make your block 8 ½ long




