





October Block of the Month Maple Leaf

Meeting called to order by President Jammie Ackley at 9:34am and invocation given by Bonnie Magid. The minutes of the September meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter after motion by Bonnie Magid and second by Donna Garland. Karen Godfrey made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report for August as printed in the September newsletter which was approved following a second by LyLa Wenneker.

#### The UFO number for November is 7.

Karen Godfrey gave a run-down on the next few meetings. Our November meeting will be our Quilts of Honor presentation. December brings our holiday party – bring a sewing related gift in the \$20-\$25 range, and ALSO a hand-crafted Christmas ornament. January will be a "Pregnancy Baby Shower" so bring bottles, diapers, burp cloths, blankets, etc. which will be donated to the Grace Pregnancy Outreach Center.

Today's program was a talk on Marbleizing on Fabric presented by Roberta Burton. She gave a short history of marbling which started in the book-binding industry probably in Japan in the 12th century and moved into Persia and Turkey. It was done in Europe in the 16th century, primarily in Holland and western Europe until the 19th century when England started marbling. There was a resurgence of marbling in the late 1970s-80s. Roberta saw a demonstration on marbling, and as an Art major in college decided to try it. Your fabric must be treated with alum before marbling so it will absorb the paint, although a PFD (Prepared Fabric for Dying) is now sold. A container is filled with water thickened with carrageenan or "marble dust" and paint is mixed to a very liquid consistency. Paint is dropped onto the surface of the water, then using tools such as combs or picks or forks the paint is

swirled into a design – usually only 2 or 3 colors plus a white or black. Fabric is laid onto the paint which "floats" on the water, then is removed and rinsed. Karen Godfrey has a couple of books in her collection Marbling on Fabrics and Marbling Fabrics for Quilts. Supplies are carried at dharmatrading.com, also earthguild.com. Roberta had many examples of fabrics she has marbled.

## REMINDER – there is a 50 cent fine for not wearing a name tag.
