Livingston Piece Makers Quilt Guild Block of the Month Dec return in Jan 2023

This block comes from the Book:

Fished Block 12 1/2 inches.

Around the Block Again

Fabric needed (A) white on White , Light blueprint , a light Gray.

Cutting: from White-on-White Cut (1) 7 1/4 square sub cut into (4) 4 1/4 HST

Cut (2) 3 7/8 Squares , Sub cut these into (4) 3 1/2 HST . Cut : (1) 4 1/2 Square.

From : Light Gray Fabric Cut (1) 7 % square ,Sub cut Into (4) 4 % HST.

From: Light Gray Fabric Cut (2) sub cut into (4) 3 1/2 HST .

From: Light Blueprint Cut (1) 7 % square Sub cut into (4) 4 % HST.

From Light Blueprint Cut (2) 3 7/8 squares Sub cut into (4) 3 1/2 HST

This a Square in a Square design . Looks hard but super Easy to put together .Piecing instructions.

Take your(4) 4 1/2 White on white Triangles match them , with the Blueprint.

Then The Gray . sew down one side and pay attention to layout of colors .

Do the same with the 3 1/2 HST triangles .



Start with the white 4 ½ square. Place blueprint 3 ½ HST on one side

Then on the opposite side, do the same with the light Gray.

Next take w/gray HST. Sew to one side of the square. Then the opposite side.

Next take w /Blueprint HST. sew to the side then the opposite side.

HST= half square triangle. Change your Needle and Iron your fabric.
