

- Mini Quilt must be made with the theme in mind using selected fabric from LaLa's Quilt Shoppe.



# Minutes

#### LPQG | 14 APRIL 2025

Vicki Wooddell, President, called the meeting to order at 9:33 am. Bonnie Walker gave the opening prayer.

#### **MINUTES AND FINANCIALS**

Vicki presented the minutes of March 10, 2025 for approval. With no additions or corrections noted, Madi **McMurry** motioned; Patty Drewett seconded, and the minutes were approved.

Vicki presented for approval the financial report as of March 31, 2025 and called for questions or corrections. Hearing none, a motion to accept was made by Bonnie Magid; seconded by Norma Christensen, and the financial report was approved.

#### **INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS**

Kay Hardy, Historian, called the current and upcoming officers forward. The current officers were thanked for their leadership and service and were officially relieved of their responsibilities in that role.

The incoming slate of officers are as follows:

President – Vicki Wooddell 1st VP/Programs – Bonnie Walker 2nd VP/Membership – Cheryl Cox Treasurer – Sharon Wright Secretary – Kathy Winter Parliamentarian — Bonnie Walker

The gavel was handed to each officer and Kay described their leadership responsibilities to them. The slate of officers was then officially presented to the **membership**.

#### **COMMITTEE & CHAIR REPORTS**

**Treasurer** Sharon Wright reported an opening balance of \$23,005.36. Income was \$1,785.00 and expenses totaled \$3,366.81. Our ending balance is \$21,423.55.

**2**nd **Vice President/Membership Chair** Cheryl Cox reported today's attendance of 52 with one new member, Judy Lovelady, who was welcomed. The Bee attendance is 19 and volunteer hours totaled 735. Cheryl presented a 25-year pin to Bonnie Walker. A 5-year pin will go to Meg Rybicki upon her return. Door prizes went to Donna Garland, Kathie Hilton, Karen Lee, and Marti Hubbard.

**Exchange Table** Mary Parrish reported that there are plenty of items available.

**Education** Vicki advised that a chairperson is needed for Education and described some of the responsibilities. Please let her know if you are interested in helping with this.

**Block of the Month** *and Row by Row* Julie Wilson, who filled in for Marci Dickens, reported there are 19 participants. There are currently 4 IOU's. Marti Hubbard won the Block of the Month.

Community Service Norma Christensen, Sharon Jeans and Bonnie Magid — Norma reported that 270 items were submitted today. There are still plenty of kits to be done and some quilts that need binding. We are in need of 350 stockings total, both small and large. Norma truly appreciates everyone who has helped.

**F.A.I.T.H.** Lisa Jefferies gave details about all the donations received from the quilt show and 5<sup>th</sup> Monday workday. Sixty neck cooling scarves were completed. Her quilt that she raffled **at the qult show**, generated \$311 which was donated to F.A.I.T.H.

Fat Quarter of the Month Sarah Bourne reported that Jackie Burck won, however, she didn't want to commit. A new drawing was done and Marti Hubbard pulled the ticket and it belonged to her! Destiny Pennington won the Fat Quarter of the Month.

**Hospitality** Vicki reported that Karen Lee has agreed to chair Hospitality starting in May.

**Historian/Publication** Kay Hardy had no report at this time.

Sheila advised that we have many magazines and books, and Karen confirmed that there are many new items to choose from.

**50/50, Birthdays, Visitors Kathleen Weeks** reported \$33 total brought in for 50/50. Julie Wilson won the \$16.50 and the balance goes to LPQG. #### **QUILT SHOW COMMITTEE REPORTS**

- Vicki Wooddell gave thanks to everyone who volunteered. Many compliments were received from vendors, visitors and members. The venue has been reserved for April 7 – 10, 2027. Total income to-date is \$4,019.
- Attendance was 170 on Friday; 53 on Saturday which was likely hindered due to weather.
- Continue with set-up on Wed., judging on Thur., the show on Fri. and Sat.
- Applications need to include more information; pictures of what's being sold.
- Need to make sure we have places for electricity.
- Take down and setup worked like clockwork.
   Vendors will need to setup on Wednesday as

- not to disturb the judging. Concessions were made to those who needed more time.
- Venue Rachel was wonderful and anticipated what we needed.
- Perhaps we could have a contest on the end cap items next time.
- Demonstrations need to be timed as not to interfere with bed turning.
- Donna Garland shared the check-in process went perfectly! Many compliments. Debbie advised we were finished by 5pm.
- Karen Godfrey reported one blue ribbon needs to be delivered.
- We do need a sitting area for our guests.
- The vendor in the lobby should be moved inside the venue next time.
- Boutique Kathie Hilton advised that the silent auction went very well and we had many helpers on both days. We can start working on donation items now for 2027.
- We need to show appreciation to those who advertised with us. Mention their ad and thank them.
- Basket Auction Marci Dickens reported the raffle/silent auction table did well considering the number of attendees this year. We made \$1,951. We want to thank everyone who donated items or baskets for this. Special thanks to B-Sew-Inn for the donation of the Jazz II and Hall to Wall Quilts for their generous basket donation.
- Donation Quilt Raffle Bonnie Walker shared that this brought \$235 and \$113 the next day.
- Admissions Patty Drewett reported that we need a sign for the entrance next year.
- Mini Quilts Sharon Wright and Cheryl Cox reported receipts of \$535 and \$166 which was turned in today. All the mini quilts sold. There were bidding wars to make it interesting.
- Community Service Sharon Jeans and Norma Christensen shared that having no signage for Admissions caused confusion at their table.
- Hospitality Karen Lee said she had excellent help and no expenses were submitted.
- Volunteers/Quilt Angels Vicki Wooddell Everyone that worked as a Quilt Angel said

- they enjoyed talking to our visitors. We needed more Angels and aprons.
- Vendors Vicki Wooddell All good but one.
   Will need revisions to booth requirements.
   Some liked having sides and some did not.
- Advertising/Sponsors Sam Paprocki not present today.
- Set Up Kay Hardy reported that six racks are at her home which need repair or replacement. Will see if there's still some for purchase; Vicki advised we need to replace them if needed.




