### September 9, 2019

Kay Hardy reported that the new Bee held at Jean's Corner was well attended. It will always be held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Friday of the month. Bonnie Walker reported that the Square in A Square Bee at the Red Barn will be held on Wednesday September 25. Bobbylee Ruskis reported that the Escapee's Bee on Thursday was being taught easy knitting by Margie Marks.

Exchange Table, Mary Parrish, said there were tote bags, pins and logo shirts for sale.

Hospitality, Debbie Bourgeois and Diana Chambers, thanked everyone for the goodies and asked those having an October birthday to supply the treats for the October meeting.

Community Services, Bitsy Barr and Debbie Baca, said that many items are being sent to Jamaica and others in need, such as jump ropes, fidget aprons and baby bonding pads. Special Projects, Joyce Trojan, asked for membership to begin making the Christmas Stockings for the Troops now. Patterns available. She also asked for items for women and said that if you know of a woman veteran that wants to join the Guild and cannot afford it, Joyce will pay their dues.



Susie P., Norma, JoAnn P., Sharon J., Karen O and Jammie all celebrated their September birthdays by choosing a fat quarter.




