### 2019 December LPQG Minutes

The meeting was opened at 9:30 AM by President, Patty Drewett, who gave the invocation.

Veteran Carlos Ayala and his family came from Fort Worth to accept a Quilt of Valor. They were unable to attend the November Veteran's Day presentation due to illness.

First Vice President, Sharon Jeans, announced the programs for January, February and March of 2020.

Secretary, Bobbylee Ruskis, asked if everyone read the minutes of the November meeting that were published in the November newsletter. She then asked for a motion to accept the minutes as published. A motion was made by Karen Goddfrey and seconded by Carol Crosby. The motion passed.

Second Vice President, Jeanie Noble, stated that 44 members and 1 visitor were present and there was a total of 569 volunteer hours from our members for the month.

Treasurer, Kathy Thompson, stated that there is \$11,265.22 in our account, with a \$10 mystery deposit that has yet to be explained. 






Lisa J. was the winner by popular vote




