1st VP/Programs—Karen Godfrey

What awesome tips, tricks and repurposed ideas were shared! I can't wait to try them out. Again, thanks to Jeannie Noble, Sue Glick, Kay Hardy, Jammie Ackley, and Vicky Myers who shared ideas along with me.

August meeting will be about the Gees Bend Quilters. Our fifth-Monday will be making blocks inspired by the Gees Bend Quilters. You will need to bring a variety of fabric scraps. I will bring black fabric to share with us all. September is a speaker Zonna Craig on the history of aprons. This also is our September Challenge due date. Apron of your choosing but must have two quilted pieces incorporated into it. Our Cathy Tullos will be speaking to us in October about what a long-armer expects from her customers.



LPQG Minutes July 12, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 by President **Jammie Ackley**. An opening prayer was given by **Nancy Brinton**.

A motion to accept the June minutes as published in the newsletter was made by **Patty Drewitt** and seconded by **Donna Garland**. It passed and minutes were approved.

Jammie went over the budget and explained about having outside speakers come to our Guild.

Karen Godfrey -1st **VP/Programs** - gave gifts to last month's presenters of favorite blocks and their history. She asked for quilting tips or techniques to be shared by members.

Karen opened July program with some tips: check at Dollar Tree for items that can be repurposed. From teacher supplies – small clothespins with numbers can be clipped to quilt rows to keep in order. Use a potholder sewn into a cone to make a scissor holder which can hang. Use a folding cosmetic bag to hold sewing items and keep them separate. A meat skewer with beads threaded on and glued can become a stiletto. Stilettos also made from wooden skewers with beads attached. Use a skirt hanger to hang blocks and keep them organized. A wooden dowel, covered with glued on batting, can be used to wrap a block around and slide into a tubular bag to prevent creases. She offered the tip that a large spool can be used to wind binding around, cut a slit in bottom to hold end of binding – can be decorated as desired. Keep a notebook with "card pages" for business cards of quilting associ-ated dealers, also take pictures and make notes about finished quilts. It's also a good idea to take a photo of quilt in progress, it might help to discover any mistakes. She said to use freezer paper for paper piecing (?). Ask her.

Kay Hardy offered a tip on how to duplicate fabrics to make small repairs. Using ink jet copier, take a picture of undamaged square. Printed Treasures makes a fabric to run through your printer. If your printer makes a "true color" copy, then cut a small shape to cover the hole in your antique/old quilt. Use Derwent Inktense ink pencils to "doctor" any colors that aren't quite bright enough. Set the colors with water or aloe vera gel using a cotton swab. Kay can answer any questions about this technique.

Sue Glick has a sure-fire way to make fast HST without cutting triangles. Instructions in this newsletter.

Jammie Ackley said she has two different machines that she might take on a retreat. She makes mesh zipper bags that contain all items she will need for that specific machine and keeps it with the machine. She also uses an eraser to fit on the end of stilettos or seam rippers to prevent accidental jabs. To "audition" a quilting design, use a see-through clear shower curtain (from Dollar Tree) and cut it to the width and length of your quilt bed. Then

draw the design with dry-erase markers. Use bright duct tape around the edges for definition, so you don't draw on the quilt.

Jeanie Noble said that when writing on a quilt label, iron freezer paper to the back of the label to add stability. Especially for hand quilters, when you have finished quilting turn the quilt over and look at the back where it is easier to ensure that all areas have been quilted.

Nancy Brinton keeps a small notebook next to her machine so that she can write the size of the zigzag stitch she uses for Velcro, or a favorite decorative stitch for a project. She also said that if you put a bright color of nail polish on the corner of your rulers it allows for easy identification if you are at a bee or a retreat.

Vickie Myers uses a belt/tie holder with large rings attached to hold patterns, stencils, and odd sized rulers.

Patsy McGowen has no wall space in her sewing room. She places a spring tension rod in the window to hold items.

Karen Lee reuses plastic fruit cartons (from blueberries, raspberries, etc.) to keep small quilt pieces in. These she can store in a larger tub.

Buy-Sell-Trade table – Mary Parrish had many items, Rose is cleaning out and had many sewing items, a wireless printer, and a photo frame (unused) in addition to the LPQG logo items and shirts for sale. Free items included books on CD and fabric.

Block of Month – *Debbie Cox* – **Karen Godfrey** was the winner.

Community Service – Meg Rybicki – has a new project, a port pillow, and had some kits with instructions available. These are for a facility in The Woodlands.

50/50 - Kathy Hilton - was won by Vickie Myers.

Education – Karen Godfrey showed a book quilt made by **Barb Persinger**.

FAITH – packing will be Thursday. **Joyce** was absent so **Sondra** will drop off the items at Livingston Physical Therapy.

Donation Quilt – was taken on July 3rd to FAITH 4th of July celebration. **Kay Hardy, Brenda Hopson, and Sue Glick** sat at the table and sold \$103 worth of tickets.

Birthdays for July - Sondra Sterling and new member Renee Page received fat quarters.

Sunshine and Shadows – **Betty Tand** has been ill, **JC Gafford** is getting stronger each day and is waiting for an opening at a rehabilitation center. **Norma Christensen** is currently riding a knee scooter due to reinjuring a ligament in her right leg.

Stash Builders – Kathy Hilton – gave information on a man that has some vintage machines for sale. Stash Builders were won **by Madi McMurry, Nancy Brinton, and Sharon Jeans** – accepted by her son **Keith Golemon**.

Webmaster – Debbie Cox – has page for Block of the Month, is linked to the Guild FB page.

Jammie Ackley mentioned a day retreat at Stagecoach Retreat, north of Coldspring, on September 27 where each person can work on their own projects or charity items to be determined.

Fat Quarter of Month – Norma Christensen – Jeanie Noble won 16 cream muslin fat quarters. Next month is any color of grunge fabric. Norma stated that she brings fat quarters that can be purchased for \$2 so people can easily participate.

Membership – Gail Kestler – there were 38 members present with 4 guests. One of the guests, Renee Page joined. The Guild logged 458 volunteer hours and 17 attended Bees. Sondra Sterling earned her 10 year pin in February, and it was awarded. Door Prizes – won by Meg Rybicki, Nancy Brinton, Claudine Hasting, LyLa Wenneker and Sondra Sterling. Meeting was adjourned at 11:05 after motion by Karen Godfrey and second from Jeanie Noble.

LPQG Board Meeting

It was decided there would be a 3 month "Grace Period" in which to pay dues after the new fiscal year begins. If not paid within that time the member would be dropped from the roster and lose any accrued time of tenure.

Add to bylaws: "Guild members can participate/have access to organized retreats. There may be a fee involved." Our Guild does **not** pay for individuals to attend retreats, that is a personal choice and responsibility.

The Block of the Month will be published in black and white. If a color print is desired, members can take a photo of the copy provided or look online and print their own. The Budget is adjusted to add an additional \$400 to carry the BOM through the end of this fiscal year next March. Motion made by **Donna Garland** and seconded by **Sondra Sterling**.

In lieu of the sponsored bus trip to the International Quilt Festival at the George R Brown Convention Center it was discussed that cars might caravan to the Townsend Rd Park and Ride on I-69. Members over age of 70 can obtain a Metro card for free, 65-69 ride for 50% off. Members should look into obtaining a card before the October trip. Community Service—Meg Rybicki

Fourteen items were collected during our July meeting.

Our latest focus project is a "port pillow". These miniature 3 inch by six inch pillows have velcro wings to attach to a bra or camisole, lifting fabric away from an IV port used for chemotherapy. These will be delivered to Canopy, one of the breast cancer support facilities in the Woodlands area. Canopy was also very grateful to receive 30 mastectomy pillows from our last focus project. Women from Polk and other surrounding counties are referred to services in the greater Houston area since we don't have these facilities. If you signed out a port pillow kit, please return your pillow at the next meeting.

Instructions for Port Pillow, compiled from various sites — Editor

This is a good scrap buster.

Cut 2 rectangles 3.5" x 6.5", and *sew-on* hook and loop (Velcro) tape 3" long. On right side of one piece of fabric, press in half hamburger style. Use pressed line to line up Velcro — put bottom of tape against pressed line. Place one piece of Velcro on each edge of right side and sew with 1/8" seam to secure, tape will be slightly offset, about 1/2". With right sides together, line up rectangles and stitch with 1/4" seam around three sides. Turn right sides out. Use a good handful of polyester fiber-fill to stuff moderately full. Turn in the end and close by hand or machine.













Sue's tip to make HST — either 8 at a time or 4

These diagrams are for 2.5" HST

For other sizes, double the size of your finished HST and add 1". Draw lines through center both vertically and horizontally (for square). Connect lines as shown (solid) and sew 1/4" on either side around the square. Cut on all solid lines. For 4, draw line halfway across rectangle, and from corner to end of line across center. Sew 1/4" on each side, cut on solid lines.





A 6"x3" rectangle will make 4 HST that will finish at 2.5"





JULY 2021— BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Sixteen members turned in sixteen 'Scrappy Pinwheel Toss' BOM blocks at the July12th guild meeting. Two members have IOU's.

The winner of this months drawing was Karen Godfrey!! She won a beautiful scrappy set of blocks that will make a beautiful guilt!

Appreciation is extended to those members who graciously contribute to the Block of the Month each month and go above and beyond with contributions of more than one block. The generosity goes a long way to help the winner create a nice size quilt!

The July (due in August) 2021 Block of the Month is the 'Ocean Waves'. This block is also known as the Snails Trail or the Monkey Wrench. I enjoyed making this one! When selecting fabric think ocean wave colors of blue paired with white Jean's Muslin.

Visual step by step instructions on how this block is put together can be found on the BOM Facebook page. Just contact me to be added to the facebook page. You will need to 'friend' me on facebook in order for me to add you to the group. The group is set to private, so that only members can view it.

All members are encouraged to participate in the monthly BOM and help the lucky winner obtain a nice collection of blocks to complete a quilt. Members can participate *without* being in the drawing by bringing blocks. Just indicate on the sign-in sheet by a 'yes' or 'no' to be included in the drawing!

Please note that as a winner of the BOM, you are required to make and bring a block each month for twelve months. Also, if you are a winner and complete your BOM quilt within six months, you will be awarded a \$25 gift certificate to Jean's Corner Quilt Shop!

FYI — In the future, BOM handouts at the guild meeting will be printed in black and white. This decision was made in an effort to minimize printing costs. BOMB — What is a BOMB??


BOMB BOX








August will be "Ocean Waves".
