## **1st VP/ Programs — Karen Godfrey**

**Cathy Tullos** gave a wonderful presentation on what a long-armer expects from us. I don't know about the rest of you but my long-armer probably dreads when mine comes. I will be more mindful when I take my quilt to her. Again, thanks Cathy for all the wonderful information.

November we will be having our Skill Builder program. The following people will be presenting Jammie Ackley, Kay Hardy, Sue Glick and Karen Godfrey.

December is our Christmas Party. Bring a twenty-five dollar gift (sewing related). If you want to participate in the ornament exchange, bring a homemade ornament in a brown paper bag. Don't forget to bring your dish for the luncheon

The September meeting was opened at 9:30 by President **Jammie Ackley**, who called on **Nancy Brinton** to offer the opening prayer.

The minutes of the September meeting, as published in the newsletter, were approved following a motion by **Karen** and seconded by **Cathy Tullos**.

The Treasurer's report for August , as published in the September newsletter, was approved following a motion by **Patty Drewett** and a second by **Norma Christensen**.

**Karen Godfrey, 1<sup>st</sup> VP/Programs** introduced **Cathy Tullos** who gave an informative talk about what a long-arm machine operator expects from their clients. She told a little about her quilting history, which began with working on family quilts for her dad, using her mother's long-arm following her mom's death in 2008. Cathy started her business in 2014 and has progressed to a computerized quilting machine at the urging of her husband. She covered such items as squaring up your block, then squaring up each section, and finally having your entire quilt squared before taking it to the long-armer. She mentioned the care which must be taken when piecing on a bias (starch, starch, starch) as well as how to prevent rippling borders. She stressed measuring your quilt at top, middle, and bottom and cutting the border using the average of these measurements. Make sure that your backing is square, ask your quilter how much "overage" they would like. If the backing is too wide it can cause sagging. If piecing the back with vertical seams, make sure to cut off the selvages because it winds too tight. She included a hand-out of tips along with another of pictures of each stage in the process.

**Karen** gave a run-down of future programs. November will be Skill Builders , December is our Holiday party with a gift limit of \$25 for the Gift Exchange. This year there will also be a home-crafted Christmas Ornament exchange. There will be a pot-luck dinner this year. January will be a Quilt of Valor presentation with drinks and cookies. If you are planning on making a QoV for presentation, the "official form" is on the website or see **Marty Desselle** for forms and/or labels.

**Jammie** pointed out a sign-up for Committee Chairs for the 2023 Quilt Show. If the Chair positions have not been filled by January, it's very possible there will be NO Quilt Show in 2023. The date has not been set, but probably toward the end of April 2023 as Easter is on April 9 that year.

**Gail Kestler – 2<sup>nd</sup> VP/Membership** reported there were 29 members and 4 guests in attendance, one of whom joined. She presented membership pins to **LyLa Wenneker** for 5 years, and a 10 year pin to **Vickie Myers.**




