LPQG Meeting for February 14, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President Jammie Ackley at 9:30a.m. The invocation was given by Karen Lee.

Meg Rybicki pointed out that the Community Service report for January should have stated "there were no contributions". Minutes with the correction were approved following a motion by **Patty Drewett** and second by **Karen Godfrey**. The Treasurer report for December as printed in the January newsletter was approved after a motion by **Vickie Myers** and second by **Cathy Tullos**.

1st VP/Programs—Karen Godfrey— March program will be Quilters' Strip poker and each participant should bring EIGHT 2.5" strips WOF. 
