LPQG Meeting for March 14, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President **Jammie Ackley** at 9:30 a.m. The invocation was given by **Vickie Myers**.

The minutes as printed in the February newsletter were approved after a motion by **Karen Godfrey** and second by **Mary Kirk**. The Treasurer report for January was approved after motion by **Jeanie Noble** and a second by **Mary Kirk**.

Jammie announced that we will have a new budget (for2022-23) for approval at the April meeting. Sylvia Sills is collecting the envelopes from Committee Chairs for any funds remaining for this fiscal year (for Donna Garland).

BOM— Karen Lee—drawing for "Holland Windmills" was won by **Bobbe Dickerson**. Next month will be "April Showers" featuring dotted fabrics.

Community Service—Meg Rybicki One of the centers which we support is the Family Crisis Center of East Texas which supports other counties as well as Polk County. They maintain a 39-bed facility for emergency use in Lufkin. The next project for the Guild is to make pillowcases for school age children, that they might take with them when they leave their temporary home.

Membership—Gail Kestler — 40 members were in attendance along with 2 guests. 19 people attended Bees and 393 volunteer hours were logged. **Bonnie Walker** received her 20 year pin.

Karen Godfrey gave a rundown on programs for the next few months: April will be installation of Officers followed by a pot luck luncheon. Quilts should be 45"x60" minimum, unless working on a wheelchair quilt which should be 36x45 min. It was suggested to round corners for wheelchairs so there are no corners to get caught in the wheels.

Unfinished Business:

The Storage Clean-out is tabled until warmer weather. The Bazaar has been scrapped as we didn't receive permission from the church. There will be no bus to the International Quilt Festival next year.

Announcements:

The Lufkin Quilt Show is this weekend. There is a new retreat facility, Papaya Creek, in Montgomery. Jammie wants to have a sew day there on 3/21 from 9-5...the cost is \$25. Jammie is hosting a retreat in Trinity at her church—Trinity Tabernacle Assembly of God on April 1-2, there will be no fee. Contact Jammie for either or both of these retreats. There is a Sew Day at Stagecoach retreat on May 7 at cost of \$15, and a retreat at that location from August 25-28 for cost of \$250.




