Our speaker for the November guild meeting was Rev. Billy Graff. He spoke about what Camp Hope is all about. Below is some information from their website. The camp is located in Houston, Texas.

— Camp Hope is a six-nine-month interim housing program located in Houston, Texas. We aim to relieve the effects of combat trauma through a whole-person approach. Its solution is to provide peer support, mentor programs, and professional development for America's warriors and their families. There is no cost for the veteran or their families. The Veterans also have sessions with Licensed Healthcare professionals weekly. There is no other location like it in the United States; to date, 44% of the Veterans have graduated from the Camp Hope program.

The Facility opened in 2012 and is in a quiet and safe setting in Houston, Texas. Residents attend group lessons and support sessions with other combat veterans. They are provided with individual mentoring sessions with certified combat trauma mentors. Participants can also go on off-site small group interaction activities trips, such as camping, fishing, sporting events, and more. Many are encouraged to get involved with local churches, businesses, and volunteer organizations to assist in their personal healing and educate the community on the invisible wounds of war. — https://ptsdusa.org/



LPQG | 10 NOVEMBER 2025

The meeting was called to order at 9:34am by Vicki Wooddell, President who welcomed all that attended.

The opening prayer was given by Patty Drewett.

Vicki presented the minutes of October 13, 2025, as published in the Newsletter and called for corrections. She brought up the speaker amount paid to our Speaker Glenda Henson was actually \$150, not \$250. camp-hope/). Billy gave us an overview of Camp Hope, the veterans they serve and how they function. They see 60-100 Vets with PTSD a week. They sign in to the program and can stay anywhere from 30 days to 1 year. They follow a four-phase program that prepares them to function independently, with resources, direction, hope and love. The members then presented Billy with quilts for the veterans.


