



Sunshine and Shadows





LPQG | 8 DECEMBER 2025

PRESENTATION OF THE SAAFE HOUSE QUILT PROJECT

On Friday, December 12, 2025, members of the Livingston Piecemakers Quilt Guild presented a quilt to Saafe House Advocates from Polk, San Jacinto and Walker Counties at The Bull Shack in Livingston.

The idea seed for a fundraising quilt began at Paul Horton Methodist Church when Terri Hackl spoke to the congregation about a safe place for families to go in abusive and domestic violence situations.

The guild charities ladies made fabric blocks and furnished fabric paints to the Livingston Saafe House group to express their feelings. After drawing pictures and writing on the blocks, guild members Kay Hardy, Donna Garland and Norma Christensen designed the quilt, pieced by Norma and quilted by Sharon Jeans. Some fabrics were purchased at La La's Quilt Shop in Coldspring, the guild's sponsor.



Terri Hackl said, "When I look at this quilt, I see so much strength. I see survivors who went from victims, to survivors, to thriving." By the way, Sharon quilted the back of the quilt with many hands that had hearts in the palms. It brought tears to some of the group. We will show the quilt at our next quilt show and other events.

The guild members were Vicki Woodall, Sharon Jeans, Norma Christensen and Bonnie Magid. The Saafe House group were Terri Hakl (San Jacinto Sexual Assault Advocate), Kim Harvey (Crises Intervention Advocate), Melissa Kimbrough (Community Relations in Huntsville), Kristin Larenz (Polk Lead Assault Advocate), Madison Free, Tara Perkins, Gaby Posaola, Laren Murphy and Zoey Brown (all Polk Advocates).

The idea seed bloomed into a unique quilt for fundraising. It was shown for the first time at the in Polk, San Jacinto, Trinity and Walker Counties, where Saafe House offices are located. A resale shop, featuring clothing, furniture, toys and antique collectibles, is open in Huntsville Tuesday through Friday 9 - 4, first and third Saturdays 10 - 2. It is located at 1426 Sam Houston Avenue. The Saafe House offices may be reached at 936-284-5560 (Coldspring), 936-291-3529 (Huntsville), 936-594-6415 (Trinity) and 936-284-5550 (Livingston). Many hands worked on this quilt and it was the guild's privilege to make it for Saafe House.




