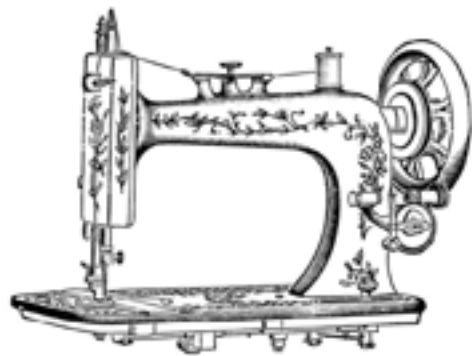

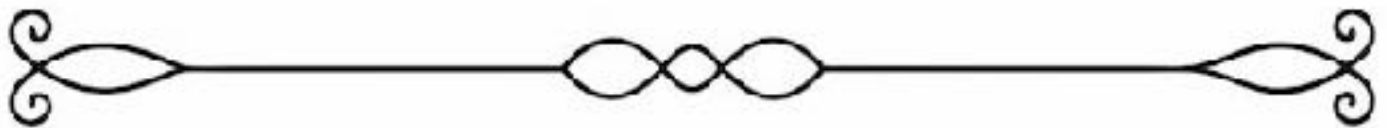
Fat Quarter Lotto

- FQ — Fat Quarter: A fabric piece that measures 18" x 22"
- WIP — Work in Progress: A quilt project that's still being worked on
- QST — Quarter Square Triangle: A square made from four triangles
- HQST — Half Quarter Square Triangle: A square made from three triangles
- UFO — Unfinished Object: A project that hasn't been finished yet
- FPP — Foundation Paper Piecing
- EPP — English Paper Piecing
- PP — Paper Piecing
- RST — Right Sides Together
- BOM — Block of the Month
- OBW — One Block Wonder
- PhD — Projects Half Done
- QAYG — Quilt as You Go

Howdy!

We had a great showing again for the Block of the Month! Shabby Rose brought 24 roses with 3 IOU's from 16 members. Cassie Hopson was our winner for May.

I am proud of everyone trying new skills. This next month is a sampler of half square triangles. The 16 square grid consist of 3.5 inch half square triangles that are white/off-white and color. Please choose four different colors made from the color wheel, with no neutrals, for the half square triangles. You may want to just use 5 inch charm squares even though the instructions state 4x4 in. It will trim down to 3 1/2 inches for construction of the block.

You choose whichever design you want or create your own to make for your one block. The really cool thing about this month BOM is it is a 2 part sampler. I stated in the meeting, the person who wins the May/June blocks will win half of the blocks and the winner of the June/July month will get the other half. Spoiler, June/July will be a basic 16 square grid made from 3.5 in squares. The two winners, we all have matching quilt blocks by July's meeting.

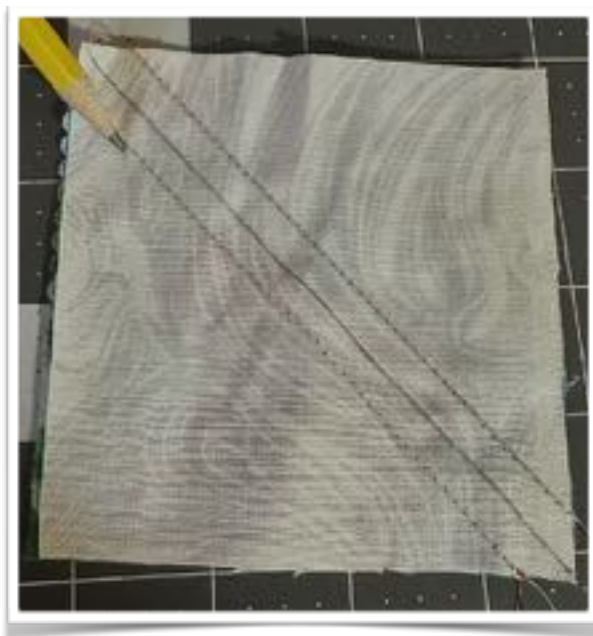
The list is long for future quilt blocks! I also appreciate so many of you giving me ideas. Just make sure it is a free pattern or original design to not interfere with a copyright issue.

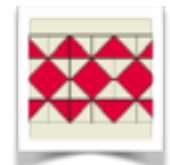
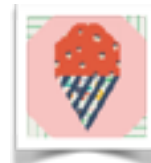

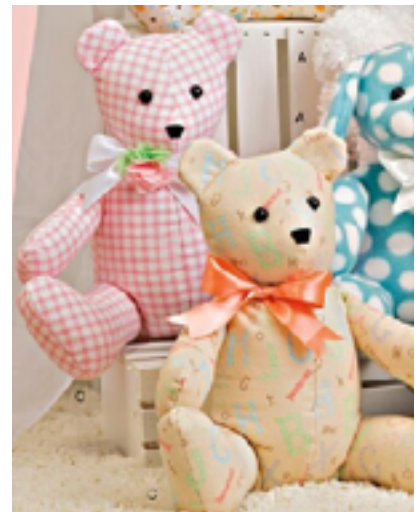
Community Service

- Piecing methods for stripes, squares, circles, and other shapes

Board Meeting was called to order by President Cheryl Cox at 11:45.

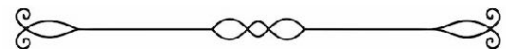
