Minutes

LPQG | 12 MAY 2025

Vicki Wooddell, President, called the meeting to order at 9:33 am and extended a warm welcome. Sharon Jeans gave the Invocation.

MINUTES AND FINANCIALS

Vicki called for corrections to the minutes of April 14, 2025 *as written in the newsletter.* Hearing none, Sarah Bourne motioned; Donna Garland seconded, and the minutes were unanimously approved.

Vicki presented the Financial Report for March 31, 2025 for approval and called for corrections. No corrections were noted. Lyla Wenneker motioned; Bonnie Magid seconded, and the Financial Report was approved.

PROGRAMS

Karen Lee introduced the guest speaker, Melinda Stanton, who presented a brilliant Trunk Show. Some of her recommendations included keeping a quilt journal and she shared types of information which is kept in hers. She also encouraged us to continue taking classes and to start with mini-quilts and small projects, then to work your way up. Questions and upclose viewing of her work was welcomed following her presentation.

COMMITTEE AND CHAIR REPORTS

1st Vice President, Bonnie Walker gave thanks to Melinda for her presentation. Members were encouraged to bring individually wrapped food items and candies in June for F.A.I.T.H. Also, in June we will have sign-up sheet and supply list for the 2-day One-Block Wonder on

July 14-15. The cost is \$25 per person and the Guild covers \$15. Members' out-of-pocket expense is \$10. Lisa Jefferies will present our program at the July meeting, and we will stay after the meeting and come back on Tuesday to finish up (9am - 3pm). Personal items can be left overnight, if desired. Be sure to bring a lunch! In August, LaLa's Quilt Shoppe will be with us. LaLa's has the Challenge Fabric which is called Happy Blooms. October's program will be a Trunk Show. November is Camp Hope with Rev. Billy Graft. We hope to have some small quilts for veterans to donate to this program. December is our Christmas Party. Bring a \$25 quilting gift in a brown paper bag. We will have Bingo!

Treasurer, Sharon Wright reported for April 2025 a beginning cash balance of \$21,423.55. Income was \$7,692.83 and expenses totaled \$2,036.68 with an ending cash balance of \$27,079.70.

2025 Budget, Vicki Wooddell advised the 2025 Budget was approved by the Board. The Quilt Show Budget will be revised once all entries are finalized. Some increases to be noted are in Storage Fees and the monthly meeting venue. Funds are reserved for asset acquisition of new quilt racks to replace broken equipment. During discussion, it was found that \$100 on the 50/50 budget line should be allocated to Fat Quarters. Donna Garland explained how the budget is configured. With the correction noted, Sam Paprocki motioned; Patty Drewett seconded; and the 2025 Budget was unanimously approved.

2nd **Vice President/Membership Chairman, Cheryl Cox** reported 48 in attendance, with three guests: Annette Phillips, Melinda Stanton, and our guest from Tall Pines Quilt Guild. We

welcome one new member, Kathy Chebret. Bee attendance is 20, and volunteer hours totaled 427.5. A 5-year pin was presented to Meg Rybicki. Door prizes went to Cathy Tullos, Debbie Cox, Karen Godfrey, and Sandy Dyal.

Exchange Table, Mary Parrish is out today.

Block of the Month, Marci Dickens explained there was some confusion from last month's drawing and that Marti Hubbard is returning her blocks. The winner for April is Connie Timm and Marci will get the blocks from Marti to her. Vicki Wooddell is the winner for May. Marci explained the rules for participation.

2025 Row-by-Row, Debbie Cox advised we're starting a new Row-by-Row and there are 36 participants. Debbie explained that each month the pattern comes via email. You will bring your row to the next meeting. It's a good project for a beginner and help can be given to anyone needing assistance. Debbie thanked everyone for participating.

Community Service, Norma Christensen, Sharon Jeans and Bonnie Magid

Sharon advised our goal is to be finished with the Christmas stockings in July. There are three quilts to be quilted and four ready to bind. We will go to the nursing homes next month and Norma confirmed we have nine quilts for each nursing home! There are 50 books for small quilts which will go to Safe House and Children's Haven. Bonnie shared information about fidget quilts. Items such as hankies, zippers with a bright backing, doilies, lace, and men's ties can be used. The backing should have apron strings. You can design your own, and directions will be provided through our website. These are greatly needed for memory care.

F.A.I.T.H., Lisa Jefferies encouraged everyone to please bring something next month for the F.A.I.T.H. packages which go to soldiers in the military. Donation examples are individually wrapped crackers; candies that won't melt, lip balm, drink mixes, fruit cans with pop tops, granola bars, small bags of peanuts, and instant oatmeal. We want to provide Bea Ellis of F.A.I.T.H. who is our guest speaker in June with an abundance of items. Financial donations and puzzle books are also welcome.

Fat Quarter of the Month, Sarah Bourne reported 11 participants contributed and the theme was big floral prints. Only three were willing to be drawn for and the winner was Mary Ann Wilson. Next month's theme is Christian prints.

Hospitality, Karen Lee thanked everyone for helping with providing food and drink.

Historian/Publication, Kay Hardy confirmed that we're to continue our listing in the Welcome Guide that is published by Polk County. She has also located a photo backdrop for \$94 through Amazon which is what's used to display our quilts in the quilt show. We will next determine how many are needed.

Librarian, Sheila Robertson & Karen Lantron Sheila advised that Karen is away and she wasn't able to have the books here today.

50/50, Birthdays, and Visitors, Patty Drewett in for Kathy Weeks announced the May birthdays and Naomi Creech won a fat quarter. Visitors also received a fat quarter. Patty reported there was \$44 received for the 50/50 drawing and the winner receives \$22. Bonnie Magid was the lucky winner!

Sunshine & Shadows, Sarah Bourne reported a thank you card went to Bonnie Walker for her generous donations for Bingo. A get-well card went to Mary Parrish. Please be in touch with Sarah if you know of someone who should receive a note. Bonnie Walker shared that on May 29th she and her husband will celebrate 59 years of marriage!

Stash Builder, Destiny Pennington pulled the following names: Sharon Wright, Connie Timm, and Judy Lovelady who will receive hers at the next meeting.

Hometown Christmas, Kathie Hilton reported it will be in December!

Webmaster *and new Web*, **Debbie Cox** stressed the importance of not sharing our membership list with anyone outside of this group.



The May (due in Jun) 2025 Block of the Month is the 'Confetti Star'. See pattern for fabric requirements.






