



# Minutes

#### LPQG | 13 OCTOBER 2025

The meeting was called to order by Vicki Wooddell, President at 9:32 AM. She requested an opening prayer which was delivered by Patty Drewett.

Vicki then reported that we had had a busy month since our August Meeting. Our September Meeting at Camp Cho Yeh was a big success. She thanked all who participated and helped. She especially thanked the Members that did fantastic and fun demonstrations. They were:

We got a chance to walk around and talk to each other. We played games. Kay Hardy did a "What's in your purse" game and everybody was scrambling to see what they had. We played Left, Right, Center with Fat Quarters and had raffles.

Our Quilt Members that participated wowed us with their September Challenge Projects.

Lastly, we had the drawing for our 2025 Donation Quilt which was won by a member of our guild, Lois Ross.

Vicki asked how many members would be interested in repeating this next year and everyone was positive. Destiny Pennington

made a motion to make this an annual event and the motion was approved.

Our Bus Trip to the International Quilt Festival was a lot of fun. We ended up with 48 people and had a great day. We had multiple riders from the Nacogdoches Guild and made new friends. Vicki thanked Donna Garland for her trip organization and Marci Dickens for providing Egg Bites and Kolaches for breakfast.

Vicki then acknowledged the Kingwood Guild for bringing their Donation Quilt which was a 250<sup>th</sup> Red, White and Blue Anniversary Quilt.

Vicki presented the minutes of the September Meeting as published in the Newsletter and called for corrections. Hearing none, a motion was made to accept as written by Donna Garland and seconded by Karen Lee and the motion was approved.

Vicki presented the Financial Report as published in the Newsletter and called for corrections. Hearing none, a motion was made by Lyla Wennaker and seconded by Kathy Chebret and the Financial Report was approved.

#### Committee & Chairman Reports:

**1**st **Vice President Bonnie Walker** – Bonnie reported on our next programs:

- November Rev. Billy Graft from Camp Hope will speak to us about his program for Veterans with PTSD. She asked that we use our patriotic quit scraps and make wheelchair quilts for them.
- December We will have our regular meeting followed by out Christmas Party. This will be a Pot Luck and we will play Bingo. There will be a Gift Exchange that is quilt related, and a gift with a \$25 value needs to be placed in a brown paper bag.

After this there will be a workshop of how to make a block design board.

- 3. December 13th will be Hometown Christmas.
- 4. December 29<sup>th</sup> would be our 5<sup>th</sup> Monday. Bonnie asked how many would be attending, took a vote, which did not pass so there will not be a 5<sup>th</sup> Monday.
- 5. January 2026 We will bring Baby Shower Gifts for Grace Pregnancy Center and present them with the gifts. Then we will have Linda Deeter as speaker on the Quilts for Kids Program.
- 6. February 2026 Kathy Tucker will speak on Studio 180.

Bonnie then introduced our Speaker, Glenda Henson with her Trunk Show. Glenda showed some beautiful quilts and spoke of her processes.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President – Cheryl Cox –** Cheryl reported an attendance of 41 and 6 guests. The guests were Theresa Derringer, Angela Pomberg, Kathy Lapham, Nancy Sizemore, Carol Barr and Judy Henly.

There were 22 Members that attended Bees and 500 Volunteer Hours.

Door Prizes were won by Kathy Chebret, Kay Hardy, Sylvia Sills and Bonnie Magid. **Block of the Month – Marci Dickens** – 22 blocks were turned in with 5 IOU's. Sandy Dyal was the winner of the blocks.

**2025** Row by Row – Debbie Cox – 22 Members showed their Butterfly Rows

Community Service – Norma Christensen, Sharon Jeans and Bonnie Magid – Norma reported 187 items were turned in and 197 items turned into Nursing Homes this month. 189 small Stockings and 152 large stockings given to F.A.I.T.H, 17 Quilts and pillowcases given to Sweats for Vets and Lyla Wenneker donated a crate of soap samples which were passed on to F.A.I.T.H.

Sharon presented her new program called P.I.G. which is Project in Gift Bag. Brown Bags are filled with scraps with white and 1-1 ½ yards of fabric. Quilt should be 36" x 42" or 36" x 36".

Bonnie spoke about the 5<sup>th</sup> Monday Fidget Quilts and that she has leftover kits. There were 11 people who attended and she held a Dum Dum drawing. Each person drew from a bag trying to get the black tipped Dumdum. The winner was Sheila Robertson who received several 3-yard Quilt Pattern Books.

Judy Lovelady donated 20 quilts to Community Service which were donated to Sweats for Vets. They gifted her some Halloween fabrics.

**F.A.I.T.H.** – Lisa Jeffries stated she received drink mixes. They are asking for beanies in green, beige, black or Olive which will be packed in the Christmas Stockings. They are no longer taking condiments.

The Oct (due in Nov) 2025 Block of the Month is the 'Slip Knot'. See pattern for fabric requirements.

Please use the Moda solid porcelain or white bleached fabrics as indicated on the patterns so the blocks are similar. Fabric can be purchased at our sponsor shop, LaLa's.

### Notes from Cheryl Cox on the Book/Journal Cover

#### Measure your Journal:

- Measure width from the right side of the cover, across the spine, to the left edge of the back cover.
- Measure height from top to bottom along the front cover. Round up to the nearest ¼ inch to make it easier.

#### For Our Journal:

- 1. Cut front and lining 16 1/2 x 11. If you do not want to top stitch, cut 16 % x 10 %.
- 2. Cut the inner flaps 11 x 7. If not top stitching, cut 10 3/4 x 7. Do not embellish the flaps or the cover will not lay flat.
- 3. If covering a book other than the one we are doing today, add 1 inch to width and height measurements for covering and lining. For flaps, add an inch to the height.

#### **Construction:**

- Fold each flap in half, wrong sides together, so each is 3 and 1/2 wide by Journal height.
   Press. Top stitch if you like.
- 2. Place the Journal exterior right side up. Align the raw edges of each pocket flap with the short edges of the exterior. Pin or baste.
- 3. Place the lining on top, right side down. Pin in place.
- 4. Sew all the way around with a 1/4 inch seam allowance, leaving a 2 to 3 inch opening at the bottom for turning. Trim corners. You can also use a stiletto to turn the corners.
- Turn right side out with flaps on lining and press. Test the fit before top stitching. Adjust
  the top stitching so the book/journal fits inside. It is usually ¼ but could be 1/8. If you
  don't top stitch, stitch the opening closed.



Notes from the Fun September Meeting at Camp Cho Yeh!



**Notes on Paper Piecing** 

At the meeting Monday, I was using "Golden Paper", I had purchased from Connecting Threads. It is now also available thru Walmart and Etsy. It comes on a roll in either 12 inch length or 18 inch by 20 yards. Golden paper can NOT go thru your printer, it is to soft. I have tried ironing it to freezer paper, sometimes it works, most times it doesn't. The other paper I've used is Vellum, it can be purchased in most stationary stores and it CAN go thru your printer, one sheet at time! Thread is another issue. The thicker thread sometimes causes seams to large. I use 80 weight in the bobbin and 50 weight on top. Available at "The Quilt Show.com or thru "Red Rock Threads.com". If using Golden paper, use a mechanical pencil or fine point pen with your ruler to draw lines. Be sure to use an "add a quarter" ruler and a post card for trimming. IF you need to unsew any seam, do it from the fabric side so as to not rip your paper by mistake. And finally, remember the steps; sew, press then trim. The only exception to that rule is when placing #1 piece. This has to be trimmed before adding #2. Any other questions, please contact me or stop by Thursday Bee.






