Note to members: as we take photographs at the club meeting if you wish not to be featured in the newsletter and on the Club Facebook page, please let us know.




Insight of a Bonsai beginner

With the cold weather we are having it has been a trial maintaining the watering of my plants and on top of the weather I have been travelling for work and pleasure. With all of this in mind I built a new watering system as the previous ones were not successful for long periods of time. This time I have tried metered and timed watering with different watering heads and patterns.

This is an area where everyone would benefit from members experience in how they manage their watering systems. Looking forward to feedback to include in a future article.

Whilst travelling in the Queensland Outback I have observed many trees growing in vast plains separated by distance and some struggling for survival, and they seem to have more of the bonsai form than many we see on the East Coast. I found this very interesting and used the observations to discuss on our long drives. While hard to take photos when travelling on these long country roads I did manage to take some which I have included one in the newsletter.




Native Showcase factsheet

Melaleuca nodosa

Prickly Leafed Tea Tree

Melaleuca nodosa Prickly Leafed Tea Tree M. nodosa is native to eastern Australia. It grows is commonly found on alluvial soils, from sandy through shale- to clay-based, as well as heathlands, and can form dense thickets. This typical habitat can be found around Lota Creek in Ransome. Areas it grows in often have poor drainage. It grows as a shrub or small tree, sometimes growing to 10 m tall with thick, papery bark and sometimes needle-like leaves with profuse heads of yellow flowers as early as April or as late as January. This is an excellent species for bonsai. There are different leaf forms of various sizes.
