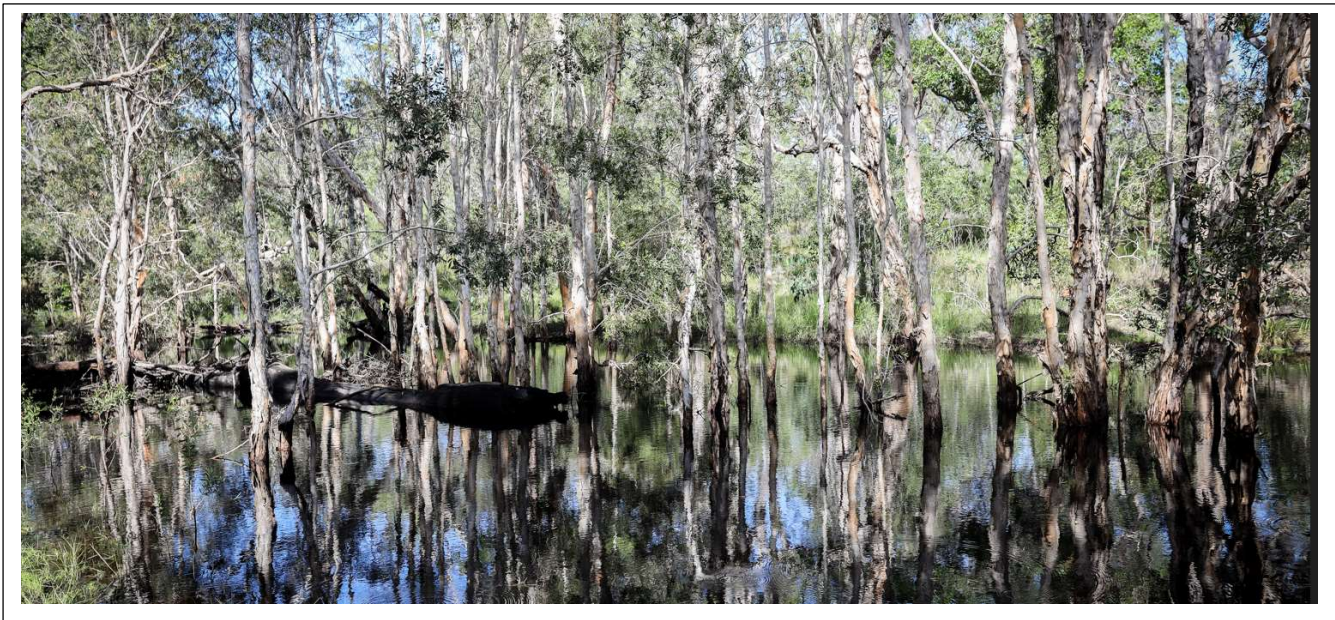
In My Garden - October 2022

I've just come back from 5 days in Gladstone working with the Botanical Gardens on their bonsai collection, again. They are working at upskilling employees and a force of volunteers to look after their growing collection, in time. They are now running Foundation programs to introduce the locals to the mysteries of growing bonsai and have a surprising number of followers of a local FB page. While there I spent a day with the latest class and then another half day with the volunteers for a workshop.

On the day with the foundations class I spent a fair amount of time talking about the stagewise process of developing bonsai, the things you hear me say a fair bit. Building from the ground up and the inside out, grow and cut and select and wire, decongest, compress etc. Seems self-evident and straight forward to those who understand but just a complex mystery to those who don't. Seeing what we do through beginner's eyes, there are lots of 'most important things' to get right. But most of it starts with knowing how plants operate and respond.

I stumbled across another new plant while away, *Decaspermum struckoicum*. A quite rare member of the myrtaceae (myrtle) family, with small opposite glossy leaves and beautiful flowers. Similar to the Grey Myrtle and anyone who grows them will know how happily they flower well as bonsai. I'm hoping the *Decaspermum* will too as its flowers are vivid white. Strange name, *strukoicum*. I've taken enough space already so will leave you to make your own inquiries.

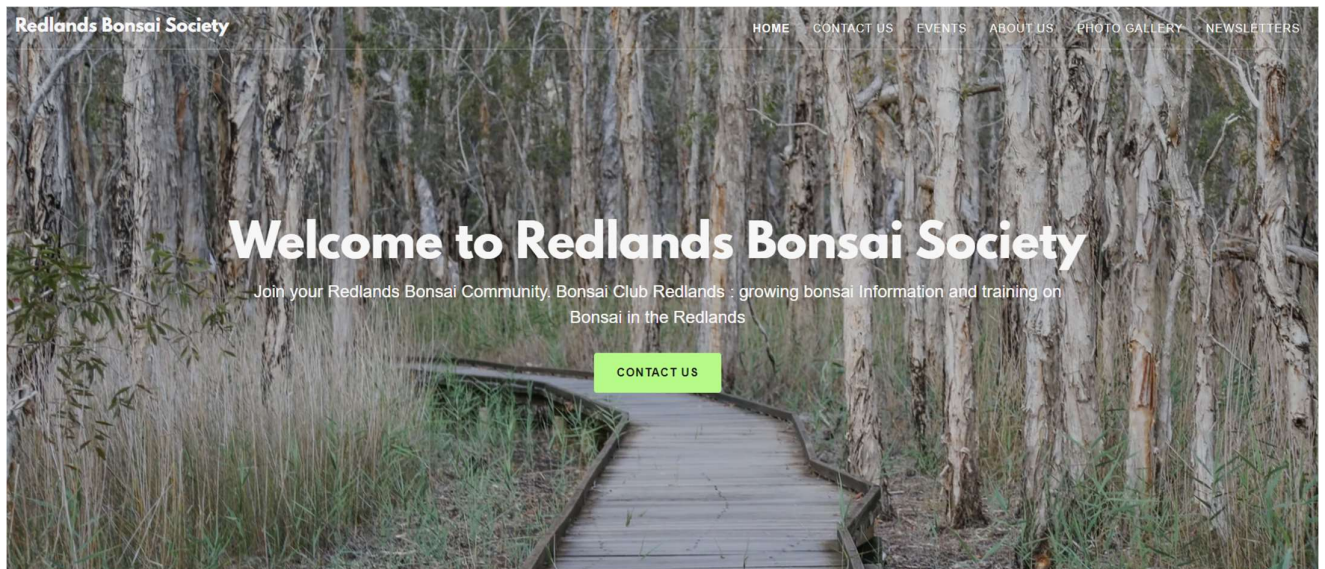
