In My Garden – October 2022

With later seasonal prep this year the seasonal start in my garden is only now picking up speed. Last year I started a lot of Ligustrum australianium (Australian privet) cuttings and after initial pruning and wiring let them grow with multiple shoots to about 400 to 500mm long. They developed nice little trunks.

A few weeks ago, I cut them right back to no more than 150mm high and root pruned at the same time. As the new shoots emerged, I applied my usual 'rules' of selection (no double or triples, no basal shoots, nor barring, and binary division only) to reduce the shoots to those I want to progress, building the 'core' structure of the tree. By this week these shoots have grown to about 75 to 100mm and were strong enough to be wired. Now I'll let them grow, only tipping where necessary to balance the growth for this season. 23/24 will be the time to start developing ramification.

The process has been just as I described at a meeting a couple of months ago. I have a number of other species where the same process is being applied to groups of developing bonsai.

I'm still watering by hand to manage the different water demands of those which have had full root and leaf pruning through to those that are now back in full leaf. I keep hearing about people killing off things like melaleucas by putting them back in a saucer of water after root pruning and hard branch pruning to bare branches. No leaves, no water is a good place to start with trees like this. Not no water of course by just enough to keep them slightly damp, never wet, until new growth emerges.

Nearly time to fertilize. I've just bought another bag of Osmocote and loaded up all the trees I've repotted with Osmocote Exact Standard that is good for 8 to 9 months, for a constant trickle, supplemented with occasional liquid fertilizing.






# New Website up and running.



# Melaleuca nodosa

# Prickly Leafed Tea Tree

M. nodosa is native to eastern Australia. It is commonly found on alluvial soils, from sandy through shale- to clay-based, as well as heathlands, and can form dense thickets. This typical habitat can be found around Lota Creek in Ransome. Areas it grows in often have poor drainage. It grows as a shrub or small tree, sometimes growing to 10 m tall with thick, papery bark and sometimes needle-like leaves with profuse heads of yellow flowers as early as April or as late as January.
