In my Garden

In colder climates than ours the arrival of spring is an important time of renewal, much anticipated and celebrated. It is the same for we bonsai tragics, who over winter, look forward to what we might achieve with our little trees in the coming season.

So it's almost a relief to at last be able to get into root pruning and repotting but when confronted with the task we are reminded quickly about just how much our collections have grown and I don't mean simply in length.

I've had a busy couple of weeks in my garden. The deciduous trees are by now settled in and producing a nice flush of new shoots. With the broadleaf evergreens, depending on where there are in the development pipeline, they have been left with somewhere between 75% and none of their former foliage after seasonal set-up. Of course, after root pruning this early the post pruning watering has to be carefully managed. To make this work I have grouped my root pruned trees by the amount of foliage on them. Those closer to ramified and with more remaining leaf can have a little more water than the ones which are earlier in development that have been defoliated and pruned back hard in the interests of building the core structure. Then there are those as yet unpruned, that have filled their pots with roots and a single watering a day is almost not enough. Its quite a juggle but like all the powerful lessons, one learned the hard way.

Insight of a Bonsai beginner

I was thinking about style and how a number of my young tree's would turn out. Although I may be not qualified to discuss this subject as my friends tell me I don't have any style and my mother said I was behind the wrong door when they were giving it out. But what I have noticed as I have travelled to the many Bonsai shows that it appears that each club has its own styles. Could this be led by club member's influence. I know through my photography that you migrate to a style and this changes over time as you gain experience. Bonsai just like photography where you have rules like the "rule of thirds" where you have a point to focus on so your eye and view is not lost in the photo. Similarly, where the tree is placed in the pot, the trunk thickness and height to the canopy are all relative to how we view the tree. You can access and view a lot of bonsai styles from books and the internet but seeing them and building the tree from the ground up is more challenging. This is where you should glean as much information from our experienced member's on how the tree was built to achieve this style. Or you could borrow from nature. Anyway, I will continue the journey as the learning is the enduring part of the hobby.
