




Insight of a Bonsai Beginner (currently travelling NT & Qld writing this newsletter in beautiful warm weather

I am writing this article from the back of Bourke or at least we went through the Bourke Shire where I have now spent a number of weeks travelling in the outback of QLD and NT, so far, we have travelled some 7,000km, 1,800 of them on dirt roads looking for Wrens and Parrots.

What I love seeing and admire is the extreme conditions our landscape places on our flora and fauna that live and grow in the outback of Australia. The sheer willpower the trees have can be seen as you walk along the creek beds to survive the immense water flow is amazing to see where debris is located 30 feet above in the trees with them leaning and then finding the way back up to the sky. Walking up mountain tracks where I witnessed a number of remarkable trees growing out of sheer rock walls in hot and remarkable dry conditions, one such tree that inspired me was what I believe was Calytrix Exstipulata (Turkey Bush).

I have included some remarkable photos of trees eking out an existence in rocks. Every plant growing along a creek or out in the open I look at the possibilities of creating a native bonsai in their style. The selection of native species is vast, and I hope to be able to grow some of my native plants into bonsai when I get back.








#### The 10th Symposium on Australian Plants as Bonsai

Treacy Centre, Parkville. August 31 - September 1, 2024.

The Victorian Native Bonsai Club will, for the third time, host the Australian Native Plants as Bonsai Symposium. The Symposium will be held at the Treacy Centre in Parkville, close to the Melbourne CBD. It is intended to continue the strong work of previous Symposiums, inspiring Bonsai enthusiasts to work with, and encourage people to grow Australian native plants as Bonsai. Together with the Symposium, The Victorian Native Bonsai Club will present an exhibition of Australian Native plants as Bonsai.

#### The Symposium will include:

- Eucalypt Presentation and Discussion on species currently being grown, and the possibilities that exist among little used Eucalypt species.
- Experiences with rarely used species and discussion on styling Australian Plants as Bonsai
- A demonstration using Yamadori material
  - Workshops (own native stock)
  - Critique of selected Exhibition trees
  - · Native forest planting
  - An invitation to a Yamadori dig on the Monday after the weekend Symposium at a property in Bend of Islands near Kangaroo Ground.

The presenters on the weekend are Marcela Ferreira, Stephen Cullum, Kevin Ritchie, Craig May, and Quentin Valentine.

There is a \$170 registration fee for the weekend, or \$85 for single day registrants. Registrants will have unlimited access to the Exhibition and Sales Area over the weekend.

- Sunday Workshops are priced at Participants \$60 each, and Observers \$20. Own tree, tools
  and wire required. (Numbers will be limited to 12 participants working with 3 tutors. 4
  Participants per workshop).
- Workshop Tutors are Marcela Ferreira, Stephen Cullum and Quentin Valentine. Choose your preferred tutor, do not be disappointed and book early.

Registrations close Friday August 23rd. We are hoping to see you in August, 2024.



#### **Bonsai Foundations Program 2024**

The almost annual Foundations Program started about 10 years ago to address a need for some more formal training in the basics of bonsai cultivation, training and styling. There are a number of Introductory Bonsai classes where students can get the 'basics in a day' and come home with a wired tree, but no idea what to do with it next.

The Foundations program weighted more towards the principles and information necessary for the long term development of bonsai.

#### Curriculum:

The curriculum has been designed with the following outcomes in mind for students:

- · An introduction to bonsai philosophy, heritage, conventions and aesthetic;
- A working knowledge of how plants grow and develop, and how to harness these natural processes in the interests of bonsai development;
- An understanding of styling alternatives and how to choose;
- Early experience in developing bonsai and an understanding of development pathways.

Three streams of content will run through the program; Bonsai practice and styling conventions, how to work with plants (horticulture) and the application of artistic expression.

This year it is planned to have 8 lessons and 2 workshops, something like the following:

Program introduction

Origins & philosophy of bonsai culture

History and different national identities (schools of bonsai)

Classification, Styles & Sizes

Stylistic conventions and 'rules of bonsai' - the general aesthetic principles

The art of illusion

#### Lesson 2

Selection of plants suitable to bonsai

Attributes

Recommended species

Tools and accessories

Physiological aspects - functions of roots, leaves, bark and how trees grow

Channelling this physiology for bonsai development

How to keep a plant alive in a pot for years

Trees to work on

#### Lesson 3

Potting mediums and components

Watering and general care

Seasonal influences and the annual cycle

Start on development pathways - where to begin, seed to advanced stock.



#### Lesson 4

Bonsai development pathways continuing Shaping & Wiring Defoliation

#### Lesson 5

Propagation methods Sourcing bonsai material Cuttings and grafting, layering

#### Lession 6

Fertilizer – nutrients Pests and diseases Insects and fungus

#### Workshop1 and Workshop 2

Will be held at times to suit the schedule and venue opportunities.

#### Class Schedule/Location

Due to other commitments the program will likely be run this year on Sunday afternoons, 1pm to 4pm.

Program dates will be set once sufficient nominations are received to run the course and book the venue. Exact dates then are subject to venue availability. In 2023 the program was conducted at the Thorneside Community Hall, 200 Mooroondu Rd, Thorneside.

Again subject to nominations, it is hoped that we might make a start in March and run through to August/Sept.

#### Fees and costs:

The fee for the program is be \$160 for RBS members (\$185 for non-members) for the 8 lessons and 2 workshops.

A deposit of \$50 should be paid on nomination with the balance payable at the first class.

The Book 'Bonsai Foundations', covers the course content and will be available for purchase if you are interested (\$30) but this is not essential.
