Insight of a Bonsai beginner

With the coming of a new year and a very hot one at that, I have started looking back at what I have learned over the past year.

In the words of Donald Rumsfeld "there are known knowns; there are things we know we know. We also know there are known unknowns; that is to say we know there are some things we do not know". The bonsai journey???

I asked Steve if I could borrow the chip inside his head for a day and he replied that it is always getting a firmware update and continuing to be reprogramed. From this message I received the knowledge with Steve's mastery is that the Bonsai journey is a never-ending road without a destination just continued ongoing learning.

What I do know is that over the last few months with the very unstable weather we have experienced is that the wind has played havoc with my trees with them being blown over and breaking new branches (Murphy's Law would have it that a plant falls over and only breaks the best developing branches, the law of the buttered bread always ends up face first). When the pots are not sitting upright and because I use an auto watering system allows, they miss out on much needed moisture, and they dry out quickly with the loss of trees when you are away for a few days. Also given the heat wave we have experienced pots sitting upright is critical to keeping them alive and thriving.

The repotting process is the one that I have feared most when you spend several years growing the plant and then lose it due to lack of technique and attention. I have lost three promising bonsai trees this year due to not defoliating the tree when repotting and the tree dies through dehydration and others where they were not secured during the extreme weather conditions. With some of my smaller trees I have just repotted and not wired into their new pots and unfortunately some 50% of them fell out of the pot with the winds and storms. This is a very valuable lesson learned and I will now wire all plants when repotting to allow the new root growth to develop and allow the tree to get the necessary nutrients to grow.
