These conventions are also a fantastic opportunity to meet likeminded bonsai enthusiasts (as well bonsai tragic's like me (a)) from all around Australia and New Zealand. It's great to share stories and talk about what species grow well in their area, and also just great to chat to people that are passionate about their tiny trees.

Headlining the convention was Koji Hiramatsu, who as well as being a master on Junipers and Pines, was equally at home styling a Claret Tops Melaleuca Linarifolia. New Zealand's Martin Walters fabricated and styled an amazing rock and tray, and with Koji combined for a magnificent mountain display. Andrew Sellman expertly crafted a collected Clerodendrum, while Lindsay & Glennis Bebb weaved their magic on a wonderful flowering Camelia. Our very own Noreen Cicala even competed in the interclub challenge under stressful conditions and received a commendation on her wiring from Koji himself.

Amongst a great selection of trees displayed by our members, I'd like to shine a light on two special things.

While the Convention's main purpose is to educate and link enthusiasts, it is also the main opportunity to raise funds, which is subsequently distributed to clubs via a generous rebate when we have visiting Tutors. Items from Bonsai clubs and private enthusiasts are offered up for donation for an auction. I would like to personally thank Teresa Stewart (member and Geoff's lovely wife), for her personal donation of a magnificently crafted quilted doona. The level of detail and artistry was stunning, and we were in awe when the hammer came down at \$2,500.





I am also massively proud to announce that Tony Watt won the National Arboretum Canberra's NBPCA Perpetual Award for the "Best Australian Style Bonsai at AABC Convention", for his magnificent Banksia Display. You all had the preview of this when it was displayed and won the top prize at our Redlands Show in April. Everyone that knows Tony would appreciate how much enthusiasm and time that he puts into bonsai and everyone that he talks with. Tony also made the announcement that he will be donating this tree to the National Bonsai & Penjing Collection housed in Canberra. Now the whole of Australia can enjoy the talent and joy that Tony sculpts with his bonsai.

It's been announced that the 37th AABC National convention will be held in Canberra on 17 - 18th May 2025. There is a massive line up of Demonstrators including Michael Hagedorn, Jennifer Price, Marcela Ferreira, Jarryd Bailey, and the National Collection's very own Sam Thompson. All are truly gifted bonsai artists and teachers.

From Karate Kid to Aussie Natives: Marcela's Bonsai Odyssey

Marcela's interest in bonsai was awakened when she first watched Karate Kid in her early teens. It wasn't until her late teens when she was gifted an incorrectly labelled Maple that her passion took off. The small tree died not long after due to the instructions stating that it was an indoor bonsai but this did not put her off. Marcela slowly built up her collection with the help and tuition from Paul Sweeney who owned the Imagination Tree bonsai nursery at the time.

She continued building her knowledge base with trial and error for many years until she joined a few Melbourne bonsai clubs. At this same time her thirst for knowledge and trying something new led her to start trialling Australian natives as bonsai, in 2012 she purchased over forty different species as tube stock and her journey began.

She is passionate about Australian natives and is always willing to encourage others to give them a go, knowing that once the bug gets into you there's no stopping it. Marcela was instrumental in starting the Victorian Native Bonsai Club in 2013 focusing solely on Australian natives as bonsai as the momentum for knowledge was growing. She has trialled many Australian species but laments the size of her backyard and lack of time for not being able to try more. Her approach to styling is a balance between classical and letting the tree dictate the next move."

BONSAI WORKSHOPS WITH MARCELA FERREIRA -

One of Australia's Premier and Most Passionate Native Bonsai Artists Sunday, 26th May, 2024

From Karate Kid to Aussie Natives: Marcela's Bonsai Odyssey

Marcela's fascination with bonsai blossomed during her early teens when she first encountered it while watching Karate Kid. However, it wasn't until her late teens, when she received a mislabelled Maple tree as a gift, that her passion truly ignited. Despite the tree's demise due to incorrect care instructions, Marcela's determination remained unshaken.

Gradually, she expanded her collection with guidance from Paul Sweeney, the owner of Imagination Tree bonsai nursery at the time. Through years of trial and error, Marcela honed her skills until she eventually became a member of several Melbourne bonsai clubs.

Simultaneously, her thirst for knowledge and experimentation led her to explore Australian natives as bonsai specimens. In 2012, she embarked on her journey by acquiring over forty different species as tube stock. Marcela's enthusiasm for Australian natives knows no bounds, as she eagerly encourages others to delve into this unique art form, recognizing that once one is captivated, there's no turning back. In 2013, Marcela played a pivotal role in establishing the Victorian Native Bonsai Club, which exclusively focuses on Australian native species, reflecting the growing demand for such specialized knowledge.

Despite her limited backyard space and time constraints, Marcela has experimented with various Australian species, although she wishes she could explore more. Her approach to styling strikes a delicate balance between adhering to classical techniques and allowing the natural form of the tree to guide her decisions.



Bonsai Foundations Program 2024

The almost annual Foundations Program started about 10 years ago to address a need for some more formal training in the basics of bonsai cultivation, training and styling. There are a number of Introductory Bonsai classes where students can get the 'basics in a day' and come home with a wired tree, but no idea what to do with it next.

The Foundations program weighted more towards the principles and information necessary for the long term development of bonsai.

Curriculum:

The curriculum has been designed with the following outcomes in mind for students:

- · An introduction to bonsai philosophy, heritage, conventions and aesthetic;
- A working knowledge of how plants grow and develop, and how to harness these natural processes in the interests of bonsai development;
- An understanding of styling alternatives and how to choose;
- Early experience in developing bonsai and an understanding of development pathways.

Three streams of content will run through the program; Bonsai practice and styling conventions, how to work with plants (horticulture) and the application of artistic expression.

This year it is planned to have 8 lessons and 2 workshops, something like the following:

Origins & philosophy of bonsai culture

History and different national identities (schools of bonsai)

Classification, Styles & Sizes

Stylistic conventions and 'rules of bonsai' - the general aesthetic principles

The art of illusion

Lesson 2

Selection of plants suitable to bonsai

Attributes

Recommended species

Tools and accessories

Physiological aspects – functions of roots, leaves, bark and how trees grow

Channelling this physiology for bonsai development

How to keep a plant alive in a pot for years

Trees to work on

Lesson 3

Potting mediums and components

Watering and general care

Seasonal influences and the annual cycle

Start on development pathways - where to begin, seed to advanced stock.



Lesson 4

Bonsai development pathways continuing Shaping & Wiring Defoliation

Lesson 5

Propagation methods Sourcing bonsai material Cuttings and grafting, layering

Lession 6

Fertilizer – nutrients Pests and diseases Insects and fungus

Lession 7

Class Schedule/Location

Due to other commitments the program will likely be run this year on Sunday afternoons, 1pm to 4pm.

Program dates will be set once sufficient nominations are received to run the course and book the venue. Exact dates then are subject to venue availability. In 2023 the program was conducted at the Thorneside Community Hall, 200 Mooroondu Rd, Thorneside.

Again subject to nominations, it is hoped that we might make a start in March and run through to August/Sept.

Fees and costs:

The fee for the program is be \$160 for RBS members (\$185 for non-members) for the 8 lessons and 2 workshops.

A deposit of \$50 should be paid on nomination with the balance payable at the first class.

The Book 'Bonsai Foundations', covers the course content and will be available for purchase if you are interested (\$30) but this is not essential.
