People from 42 clubs from every state and territory (except NT), and friends from NZ, gathered in Canberra for a long weekend packed days of hearing about, watching demonstrations, and gas bagging about bonsai and any other topic that came up along the way.

For me, it was my first big bonsai function away from Brisbane, and a wonderful chance to meet like minded people, and experience some amazing bonsai art and technique.

Friday started with a visit to the National Bonsai and Penjing Collection at the National Arboretum, which is the best public collection in Australia, on permanent display in a magnificent purpose built facility, nestled in an amazing gardens (with 100 groves of 100 different types of trees surrounding it). That had me geeking out on bonsai. As it was autumn, all around Canberra we have been treated to a delightful autumn display of reds, oranges and yellows from the deciduous trees scattered around the city and suburbs, paired with crisp, clear weather. I was feeling pretty delighted with Canberra.

Little did I know that waiting at the convention location on Friday evening was the most amazing exhibition of enthusiast trees brought in from around the ACT, NSW and Victoria. Host Club, the Canberra Bonsai Society outdid themselves by assembling an exquisite assortment of all of your favourite trees, styles, pots, stands and everything else required to make outstanding artistic displays. I felt like a kid in a candy store.

Even better was the opportunity to talk to their proud owners and other bonsai enthusiasts about these gems.

On Saturday and today (Sunday), we got to hear from and see demonstrations from two amazing presenters from the USA; the wickedly funny bonsai artist, and writer Michael Hagedorn, and the delightful ballerina turned bonsai artist Jennifer Price. Their



billing was supported by the talented, respected and beloved local bonsai stylists Marcela Ferreira (VIC), Jarryd Bailey (TAS) and Sam Thompson (ACT), who crafted amazing trees while being supported by engaging MC's who ensure that there was a constant stream of interactive informative commentary from the presenters on their creations and other interesting bonsai (well mostly) topics. Demonstration material ranged from Mature Pines, junipers and other traditional conifers, to some truly stunning collected native plants.

We also had some fascinating presentations on the art and science of ceramics for our pots, which has given me an even deeper appreciation of the magic and skill of the container that cradles our labours of

love. We were updated on the National Bonsai and Penjing Collection, and challenged to look forward to the future evolution of our hobby, and what we need from our community to continue to make it vibrant and engaging.

Although I don't have any trees with me, I am attending workshops with both Jennifer and Michael tomorrow as an observer, to help glean some of their knowledge and gain some pearls of wisdom.... undoubtedly mixed in with some coffee and a natter to my new bonsai diehard friends.

If I haven't put you to sleep so far, the next convention has just been announced, and will be held over the for the first weekend of May 2026, in the delightful destination holiday location of Hobart. The brochure is attached, and I will be talking more about this in the coming months.

Gushing completed.

At our meeting on Saturday 24th May, we have are conducting a all day workshop where your can bring your trees and ask for advice. This will be supported with a follow up activities on creating your own artificial rocks

with Tony Watt, a session to brush up your wiring skills with Steve Cullum, and an interactive presentation on the Convention in Canberra (ok, the gushing isn't quite completed).

For our meeting on June 28th we will be joined by talented bonsai artist Quentin Valentine, who is joining us from Melbourne. Ouentin is well known, and is highly regarded in Victoria with over 35 years of experience, and this is his first ever visit to talk to a bonsai group in Brisbane. Now retired to a life of peaceful bonsai obsession, Quentin worked in horticulture for 30 years and took up bonsai in 1989 after borrowing a book from the library. He thought "I could do that easily" and so he did, helped by the numerous variety of plants he was already propagating in the backyard. One tree remains from that first batch of trees, a shohin Liquidamber! Quentin joined a few clubs and went to Japan Seminar House as he sought advice and gradually developed his skills. He is prepared to tackle almost any plant material and has tried his hand at an increasing number of Australian species. He now has a number of significant Australian native bonsai as well as continuing his interest in Pines, deciduous trees, and broadleaved evergreens. He has had trees on display at the National Bonsai and Penjing Collection of Australia in Canberra. Quentin was one of those instrumental in setting up the Victorian Native Bonsai Club that commenced in 2013, and took on the presidency at that time, as well as imparting his knowledge at meetings and workshops.

After seeing his personal collection, I have been blown away by not only the breadth of varieties of species, and styles, but also the breath taking levels of refinement (I was lost for words)

He will be doing the rounds at our general workshop on Saturday morning, before presentation and demonstrating in the afternoon. He will also be hosting 2 sessions of paid workshops on the Sunday, where



I encourage people to attend to seek his guidance for styling and refinement, but if you don't have a tree, just come along to observe. You will learn so much.

Lastly the Bayside Community Fund raffle ticket sales have been sensational so far. A reminder that both the sold tickets stubs and money, and unsold tickets are due back at this week's meeting.

More tickets will be available for sale on Saturday, and as a reminder, the Bendigo Bank have set up, and then donated \$30,000 over 13 prizes in the form of savings accounts from ranging from \$15,000 to \$1,000. There will be only be 40,000 x \$5 tickets, and they are exclusively sold by Bayside community groups. And the best part is that Redlands Bonsai gets to keep the money from the tickets we sell. I'll repeat that again, Redlands Bonsai gets to keep what money our members raise through these sales.

Aswell as physical raffle tickets, there is also the option to purchase tickets right up to 5pm on 30th May, via a secure website, which is accessed by a QR code printed on the promotional flyer we have printed for you.




