Insight of a Bonsai Beginner

With the recent club member event providing a free native tube stock, I would like to encourage everyone to attempt to grow trees from the available free stock. Having received several trees from the club giveaway some three years ago and having enjoyed seeing the trees grow and the learnings that I have gained from keeping and the growth of this tube stock.

The value of growing native trees is how fast you can gain a look of a mature tree in the base trunk in such a short period of time. I displayed at the last meeting several trees that I had been maintaining and growing over the last three years and as you can see by the photos that some great trunk growth has been developed over this period. I will now be looking to achieve the ramifications off the branch structure within these trees over the next two years.

On starting the journey with these trees three years ago I did not fully understand the process required to develop the stock into the start of a bonsai structure so as you would have read from some of my articles is that I thoroughly enjoy the growing of my trees. So hence the great development of the trunks and the lack of development of the branch structure and ramification.

So now with a new understanding and armed with new tube stock I will be looking to growing two trees the same variety alongside each other. One where I will be looking to grow the trunk quickly and then develop of the ramification later. The second is where I will look to achieve earlier branch ramification through the binary cut and grow method. This will be an interesting experiment in seeing which process leads to the quickest achievement and best bonsai structure.

Experience now tells me that everything takes five years in bonsai so with the event of my trees now being three years old and I will be looking to achieve ramification of these trees I look forward to reporting back in our newsletter over the next two years of the development.

I am hoping this encourages members to take this opportunity to go out and grow a native tree and see how fast you can achieve a bonsai. I will be looking forward to seeing the development of your trees and hope to see you reporting back showing your achievements to your fellow club members.

If you have a photo of your progress, I will add to the newsletter to inspire other members on their journey.

You will see that on the tree photos below of my three-year-old tube stock that I have placed a golf ball in the picture to show trunk size as I find it hard to compare and visualise from the size in the photos and time and the tree history.

You will also see the new tube stock in the photo from the same starting point three years ago. The trees will be cut back in the coming weeks and the binary cut and grow method started.


