July was a great meeting, and I think we all learnt quite a lot more about how to display Shohin bonsai. It would be great to have more displays of these dynamic works at future meetings and shows.

Our Deciduous plants are waking up, so that if you haven't reported them already, and their buds have started to extend (but before the leaves have burst open), this is the best time to repot. Act now!

Due to the way the calendar sometimes works, we have our Wednesday Night Workshop this 21<sup>st</sup> August (3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the month). Please come along for advice, assistance, bonsai chat, and beverage or two.

At this month's main meeting (Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> August) we will be *giving away* native tube stock and will have a workshop with training stations on:

- Repotting We'll talk about soil mix, and show you what to do, and if you are unsure about how to repot, or want help to repot (for example, if it's a big tree), bring your tree in and we will have members available to give you a hand.
- Wiring Get some wire on your evergreen's to get some movement in the hardened off growth before it becomes too hard to bend

### In My Garden - August 2024

In 2018 and then again in 2020 I bought some Metrosideros queenslandica, or golden myrtle; now known as Thaleropia queenslandica. They only come from a small area near Cairns, although there are a couple growing in Mountjoy Terrace in Manly and every year they make a spectacular display of golden yellow flowers.

The first two did not recover from my normal practice at the time of seasonal root and branch pruning in spring. Not a shoot. So I tried again and got two more and when they grew a little struck one cutting. The second two succumbed in the same way when it was their turn. That's probably the definition of insanity. I think I was being given a message and decided to move on to other things.

But this year I revisited spring root pruning without branch or foliar pruning. The strategy is to harness the root stimulating effects of apical shoot generated Auxin, not to mention photosynthate from the leaves, by leaving the foliage and in particular the apical shoots in place when root pruning. August offers mild weather and is conducive to this practice, providing an opportunity for quick root recovery. Developmental branch and foliar pruning can then be done when the weather is warmer. thus separating interventions. I started work on my evergreen trees in this way in late July and by mid August have root pruned some 50 trees with hardly a suggestion of a problem.

Which brings me back to my surviving cutting struck golden myrtle. It continued to grow over

winter this year and had a nice flush of fresh leaves and shoots. If there was ever an acid test of the 'full foliar root pruning' strategy, this would be it. I went ahead and root pruned it as I had with the others, taking off 60 to 70% of the roots and as you might guess it didn't look back, not even the slightest wilt! Now I know how to deal with them I'm looking forward to the foliar prune to strike some more cuttings.
