A massive report on the impacts of Micron Technology's plant chipmaking complex in the Syracuse area is officially public.

Officials posted the report online today. The document is thousands of pages long and covers a litany of the vast effects the <u>Micron project</u> could have on Central New York.

Topics covered range from population growth and housing needs to traffic and pollution.

Although the Micron report was officially made public just today, Syracuse.com | The Post-Standard <u>obtained the bulk of it previously</u>.

The report is a critical step in Micron's plans. Onondaga County Executive Ryan McMahon said previously that one public hearing on the report will be held, likely in July.

Micron is on a tight timetable.

The full process for reviewing the report could take months and the company wants to start clearing trees from the chip plant site in November.

It's aiming to start construction in early 2026.

The impacts of the Micron project will <u>reverberate in Central New York for decades to come</u>.

The company has said it ultimately plans to build four chip plants, or "fabs," at a site located in the in the town of Clay. Full construction will take 20 years.

The complex will eventually employ up to 9,000 people, Micron has said.

Officials have also said tens of thousands more jobs will develop in the region as a result of the plants. That includes everything from new teachers and cops to positions at Micron suppliers that could eventually locate in the area.

Micron has been promised billions of dollars in incentives to build the complex. The project is the largest single private investment in the history of New York state.
