Schedule Changes

If you are unable to fulfill your assignments, you will find your own replacement umpire. If you call the softball assignor, any help that can be offered will be given. If possible, a list of available umpires will be supplied. You can also find out what level of umpire you must get for the game. Please remember that an applicant may only work with a member, not another applicant.

If you give your assignment to another umpire, you must call the softball assignor to inform her of this fact. If your replacement doesn't show up and the assignor is not made aware of the change, you will be held responsible.

If you accept an assignment from another umpire, you must call the softball assignor to inform her of this fact. If not told of the switch, the original person will get paid and will be informed if the games are changed or canceled.

If there is any difference between what you are scheduled to umpire and what you actually do umpire, you must call the assignor. If you can't umpire all of your games because of rain, sprinklers, or lights going out, call and inform the assignor. This includes if you go to a park and all games are rained out, you won't get paid your one game fee if you don't call in.

Examples:

- 1. One team only has eight players. A forfeit is declared. Don't call the assignor. A forfeit is a complete game; the assignor does not need to know about this.
- 2. You go to the park and all games are rained out. Call the assignor or you won't get paid your one game fee.
- 3. You're in the middle of the first or second game and the lights go out. You wait 20 minutes and they don't go back on and the director says he can't get them on for the rest of the night. Call the assignor.
- 4. You're in the middle of your last game. The sprinklers go on and don't get turned off until the field is unplayable. Call the game. Note the line-up card with all the details and call the assignor.
