Clergy Selection and Team Selection

There's been some confusion with the new manuals on how clergy teams are selected and the team selection process, so I thought I'd give you a little information for your use and reference.

The qualification and responsibilities for Walk Spiritual Directors is found in Section 4 of the Director's Manual (pages 23-27).

The qualifications for Assistant Walk Spiritual Directors is found in Section 5 of the Director's Manual (pages 29-34).

Here's how the actual choosing of the Walk Spiritual Director takes place from the Emmaus Ministries Community Manual, page 53. It states, "The board will select a Lay Director and a Spiritual Director." It goes on to say, "The board finalizes the selection of the events leaders at least one year prior to the planned event." We also find on page 53-54, "In most Communities, the selection of event team leaders is part of an ongoing conversation about emerging leadership and the most qualified candidates for the position. The Community Spiritual Director guides the recommendations of the event's clergy team leader. The Community Spiritual Director is encouraged to bring recommendations to the board a year or more in advance. This timing allows qualified clergy to free their schedules for those events. Selection of the event team leaders is a matter of discernment through prayer and consensus of the Community Board." The Community Manual also lists qualifications and expectations for Team Leaders (including the clergy team leader) on pages-54-55.

That's the process for Walk Spiritual Directors. Of course, we welcome the input of community members throughout the year, helping us know of emerging clergy leaders that we should be keeping in mind for future leadership positions.

Assistant Walk Spiritual Directors are a bit different. A list of potential Assistant Spiritual Directors are chosen through the Team Selection process outlined on page 55 of the Emmaus Ministries Community Manual, but the selection of those positions is done by the Community Board.

Once the board has selected the event team leaders, the selection process for the remainder of the team begins. The goal is to begin this selection process at least six months prior to the event. The Team Selection Committee refers to the group responsible for selecting the remaining team members for an Emmaus event. For an Emmaus Ministries Community, the Community Board establishes the Team Selection Committee. These include:

A Board member who is responsible for team selection and w ho serves as committee chairperson.

Event team leaders

Two to four members of the Community (non-board members) who represent a cross-section of the Community, all of whom have a broad awareness of the Community membership and a solid understanding of team needs.

The Community Spiritual Director works with the Team Selection Committee to provide continuity for the long-range selection of clergy and cultivation of a pool of future event spiritual leaders. Additional guidance for clergy involvement through the Walk is found on pages 63-64. It says, "The Team Selection Committee strives to include on each team a clergyperson who shows promise as a future event team leader. In this way, those who meet the guidelines to be an event team leader receive regular training and preparation to serve as one by experiencing the entire event from the team side. The Team Selection Committee also tries to include on each team a clergyperson who has never served as a team member. This approach to selection helps the Community expand the pool of potential event clergy team leaders and deepens clergy appreciation for the Emmaus ministry through their involvement. The Team Selection Committee plans ahead with the spiritual leader and asks clergy twelve months in advance to commit to an entire Emmaus Ministries event."

Additionally, the Team Selection Committee is tasked to intentionally recruit both men and women clergy among the clergy speakers on teams for both men's and women's events. This rationale represents the reality of pastoral leadership for both men and women in the church universal today. It is recommended that the Walk Spiritual Director be the same gender as the participants, however this is only a recommendation and not a requirement.

The Team Selection Committee is to staff the team with approximately one-third new conference room team members, one-third second of third-time team members, and one-third team veterans. Clergy talk assignments are also made by the Team Selection Committee.

So, the Assistant Spiritual Director process beings with the event spiritual director and the Community Spiritual Director working together to develop a list of potential Assistants for the Team Selection Committee. The Team Selection Committee completes the list of Assistants and forward the list to the Community Board for selection. The Walk Spiritual Director then makes the calls to assemble the clergy team. (page 52 Community Manual).

That's it. To be totally transparent, that is the process as it is outlined in the new manuals. I wanted everyone to be aware of these changes so we can continue to pick the best clergy teams available in conjunction with the goals of the Emmaus Ministries guidelines.
