## Such a Time as This

Esther 4: 12 When Esther's words were reported to Mordecai, 13 he sent back this answer: "Do not think that because you are in the king's house you alone of all the Jews will escape. 14 For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?"

As the Walks are quickly approaching, please be in prayer about who you can sponsor and to volunteer. Trainings have begun for Inside Teams and both Walks are still short on volunteers and pilgrims. Volunteers are a crucial part of making the Walks successful and to simply have staff to host a Walk. Walks also cannot happen without pilgrims, so please help get those applicants.

Just as Esther was scared and apprehensive about approaching King Xerxes, you may be worried if you should do something for these Walks. I urge you to pray, pray again, and pray some more! This could be your time. Your time to bless someone else and be blessed. There are many you can be the hands and feet of Christ for these Walks: sign up for the Prayer Vigil, bring snacks and drinks, give agape items, volunteer for an entire weekend or one day, and many more!

Walk Fees

Volunteer fee: \$175

Pilgrim fee: \$190 (\$95 deposit)

These fees cover lodging, meals, insurance, literature, and some supplies.

#### Scholarship Funds

In order to fund future pilgrim and team scholarships, the Board has established the Scholarship Fund. Since Cross point Emmaus Community of Oklahoma,

Inc. is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, donations are tax-deductible and letters may be issued for donations to the Scholarship Fund. Future scholarships will be limited to

the balance of the Scholarship Fund, so contributions are greatly appreciated.



#### How has Emmaus Impacted my Life?


#### I think the real question is: How has it not impacted my life!

There isn't enough space in the newsletter to explain all the different aspects Emmaus has impacted my life since my walk. Cross Point Walk to Emmaus #12. What can I say, it's been a journey. For one, I opened my home for many years to foreign exchange students therefore my number of children have increased from 2 to 8. These students lived with me for 9 months and they are my kids. Several of the students did not come from a Christian background and while living here in Madill, OK they experienced God's unconditional love from me, my friends, and my church family. The world has opened up to me since my walk. Fortunately or unfortunately, I organize the mission team from our church. We have seen the poorest of poor in Guatemala and Cuba. We have helped clean up after hurricanes in Mississippi and Texas. We worked on a home for an elderly couple in West Virginia thru ASP. We have worked within churches in Alaska and Oklahoma. I accompanied my 80 year old mother on an evangelical mission trip to Rwanda, Africa. (That was interesting) My mother, who had never been out of the country, wanted to go to Africa. My favorite mission was going to Bolivia and working with Susan Waite on a Women's Empowerment Seminar with the Bolivian ladies. As Christians we are all called to be the hands and feet of Christ in many different ways. The Emmaus experience brought clarity to my life and expanded my borders. Sometimes fear is the wall that keeps us from allowing the Holy Spirit to work through us. Being asked to be the Lay Director for an Emmaus Walk was one of those moments that I could easily erect a wall of fear. I'm not great at speaking in front of a large groups. I'm more of a behind the scenes person. Being the Lay Director, is me totally relaying on God. When I'm asked what is so special about the Emmaus walk? I know that some of you will be going to Israel soon. I had the opportunity last May. The questions about Emmaus came up while in Israel, my response was, "after going to Israel you will have a greater understanding of the Bible. You will have walk where Jesus walked. You will see the landscape where Jesus preached. You will touch the shores of Galilea, and the tomb where Jesus was laid." Clarity! Emmaus is a three day opportunity to be immersed in the unconditional love God offers to each of us without distractions from the world. Yes, you might learn & experience a thing or two while there! I extend the invitation to come on your Walk to Emmaus. Men's walk is March 28-31 and the Women's walk is April 4-7. The word that keeps bouncing around in my head and heart for the women's walk is "faithfulness". Hmmm! I wonder what God has planned? Please join Joe Rison and myself as we lead the next set of walks.

<sup>13</sup> Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles<sup>[a]</sup> from Jerusalem. <sup>14</sup> They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. <sup>15</sup> As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; <sup>16</sup> but they were kept from recognizing him.

As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther. <sup>29</sup> But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them.

<sup>30</sup> When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. <sup>31</sup> Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. <sup>32</sup> They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"
