Black Diamond Foundation September 2023 Update

Hurricane Idalia

While Citrus County escaped the 120 mph winds that hit 80 miles northwest of Black Diamond, the low lying areas west of highway 19 in Crystal River and Homosassa saw considerable damage as thousands of homes and businesses were impacted by the seven foot storm surge. Citrus County has been declared a disaster area by the federal government.
