A key initiative is the chapter's BIPOC Opportunity Fund (Black, Indigenous, People of Color), which aims to support local BIPOC-led nonprofits by providing funding and expert guidance, thereby fostering a more inclusive and equitable sector. In 2025, AFP Greater Austin successfully achieved its goal of raising \$50,000 for the fund's inaugural year.
