At the core of this outreach is the Patient Care Center—a vital thread in the fabric of support for those navigating the storm of diagnosis and treatment. Here, individuals find not only accurate education and information but also tangible assistance in the form of emotional support, screening and diagnostics, and financial assistance. In fiscal year 2025 alone, Susan G. Komen® provided help to 3,711 patients across Texas, including \$814,400 in financial aid to those in active treatment or living with metastatic breast cancer.

This isn't just charity—it's triage for the soul. It's the difference between choosing between groceries and chemotherapy. It's the quiet reassurance that someone sees you, hears you, and is fighting alongside you.

These events serve as catalysts for research breakthroughs, policy advocacy, and expanded patient care. They remind us that healing is not

just medical—it's communal. It's found in shared laughter, collective tears, and the unyielding belief that together, we can end breast cancer.

BOLD GOALS, OPEN ARMS

Despite a 44% decline in breast cancer mortality rates in the U.S. since 1989, the journey is far from over. Too many lives are still lost. Too many families are still shattered. According to Joanna Linden, Executive Director of Central Texas Susan G Komen, that is why "Susan G. Komen" takes a comprehensive, 360-degree approach to ending breast cancer—funding groundbreaking research, providing direct patient support, driving policy change, and uniting communities".

To date, Susan G. Komen has invested more than \$3.5 billion across its pillars of impact, contributing to 29 of the 30 breast cancer drugs approved by the FDA over the past three decades. But the most powerful investment is in people—in volunteers, donors, survivors, and advocates who refuse to accept breast cancer as a permanent reality.

In many ways, Susan G. Komen is like a pink ribbon stretched across the region, each loop tied by the story of a survivor, a caregiver, a researcher, or a volunteer. Together, these threads form a tapestry of hope and determination for those still walking through the challenges of breast cancer. Some knots are tied in grief, others in triumph, but all are
