 bequeath to be bestowed upon me after that my debts are paid in mine own name and
 to the first of my will & bequeath unto my daughter some William Odoms which I made at
 of land with all the house & appurtenances to the same it bequeath the same that I now live upon & bequeath
 I will & bequeath to my daughter some 100m which one third part of all my moveable Estate & the
 of my will & bequeath to my daughter Ellen Odom one third part of all my moveable Estate & the
 of my will & bequeath unto my daughter some Richard Odom one third part of all my moveable
 Estate & the 100m my will is that my whole Estate shall be at my charge to the bequeath of my
 some Richard Odom until he come to the age of 16 years & 6 months & at that age of 16 years & 6 months
 it is my will & my daughter Odom be at full age to receive his third part of my Estate that I
 have now by this my last will & testament bequeath unto him. Also it is my will & my daughter Odom
 Odom be at full age to receive his third part of my Estate with all my bequeathment which I now live
 will & testament. Also for his land & house. Three years after the date of this my will & testament
 I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Wainwright Child one Dove value & the value to be paid
 out of my whole Estate that I will & bequeath unto my servant Elizabeth Wainwright her house
 of furniture that she hath now to some use And if Elizabeth Wainwright be a child from my
 service or any for me. Goe soon as I shall depart this life. Also my will is that if any of my
 children die before he or they come to age here in my will I express that then his or their third
 part of my Estate to fall to my wife or child that will bequeath. Also it is my will
 & will to be bound between the two apple trees & standeth at my house & the wife
 I do by this my last will & testament make & ordain & full improve my bequeathment
 & bequeathment unto my daughter to see that my last & testament performed when and it shall
 please God to take me out of this world to be performed to his will. Witness my hand & seal
 this first & twentieth day of January 1662

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN the last will and testament of Mr. William Odeon being weak and sick but in perfect memory and knowledge praised be to the Lord for it- ffirst I bequeath my Soule into the Hands of my Redeemer from whence it had his being next I bequeath my boddy to ye ground to be decently buried. 2ndmost I bequeath my Earthly Estate that God hath been pleased to bestow uppon me after that my debts are paid in manner or forme as followeth- FIRST I will and bequeath unto my Lovinge sonne William Odeon my whole dividint of land with all the housings belonging to the same it being the same that I now live Uppon. Likewise I will and bequeath to my Lovinge sonne William Odeon one third part of all my moveable Estate. Likewise I will and bequeath to my Lovinge daughter Ellen Odeon one third part of all my moveable Estate. Like wise I will as bequeath unto my Lovinge sonne Richard Odeon one third part of all my moveable Estate. Item - my will is that my whole Estate shal be at ye charge to bringing upp of my sonne Richard Odeon untill he come to the age of Seaventeene yeres at which age of Seaventeene it is my will that my sonne Richard Odeon be at full age to receive his third part of my Estate that I have now by this my last will and testament bequeath unto him, alsoe it is my will that my sonne William Odeon at full age to receive his third part of my Estate which I now bequeath him by this my last will and testament; as alsoe his land and houses three yeres after the date of this my will. Likewise I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Manninges child one cowe value and the calve to be deducted out of my whole Estate. Alsoe I will and bequeath unto my servant Elizabeth Manninge her tyme of servitude that she hath now to serve me and ye said Elizabeth Manninge to be released from my service or any for me soe soone as I shall depart this life. Alsoe my will is that if any of my children dy before he or they come of age hercin my will expressed that then his or their third part soe duerest to fall to ye rest of any children or child that are Livinge. Likewise it is my desire and will to be buried between the two apple trees that standeth at ye end of my ould house. Likewise I doe by this my last will and testament make and ordayne and full impowre my Lovinge frend ffrancis Frazer to be my Overseor to see this my last will and testament performed whenon it shall please God to take me out of this world to restore me to his own. Witness my hand and seale this give and twentieth day of Januuary 1662.

and Seven pence of this currency and one shilling and half
One Wheel One Shovel One Trunk One Shovel Dish and
One Shovel Basin
- I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Odom Twenty
Shillings and Seven pence of this currency and one shilling and half
One Wheel One Shovel One Trunk One Shovel Dish and One Shovel Basin
Likewise I Give and bequeath unto my two Daughters Mary & Elizabeth

Under my Stone (called Spark) for a Bag of Seathens Lining
 Fether (Goulds) Thicks my Winesse Lining and all the Great Lining
 there to be equally divided between these both in full of the Division
 and no more

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Patience Odom the
 Service of my Nigra man called Sandee during her Natural Life and
 after her Death to be taken to my Son William Odom and his heirs
 forever. Likewise I Give and bequeath unto my Wife Patience
 Odom Twenty pounds (each) of this (currency and one) Feather bed and
 Furniture to her and her heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son William Odom the Plantation I now
 live on to him and his heirs forever Likewise I Give unto my Son
 William Odom all the Rest of my Estate both in Deeds and and Deeds
 to him and his heirs forever for the Good and (change) of his Mother
 during her Natural Life and for the Managing of this my last Will
 and Testament I do Nominate (constitute) Name and Appoint my Son
 William Odom my heir and sole Executor in Witness Whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal this 24th of December 1743

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN I William Odeon of Norfolk county of Elizabeth River Being Sick and Weak but of Sound and Perfect Memory thanks be to God for the same and calling to mind that I was born to die and putt off my fleshly Nature I do here ordain this to be my Last Will and Testament in form and manner as followeth. First I give and bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it to me and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken hoping at the General Resurrection to Receive Salvation for the same through our Lord Jesus Christ to whom be Glory with the Father and the Holy Ghost Amen. And as for my worldly Goods I give in form and manner as followeth.

Item-- I give and bequeath unto my daughter Patience Butt five pounds cash of this currency in full and no more.

Item --I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Odeon two pounds and three shillings and seven pence cash of this currency and one cow and one calf in full and no more.

Item-- I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Odeon twenty five pounds and three shillings cash of this currency and one cow and calf one wheel one chest one trunk one silver Dram cask one pewter dish and one pewter Bason.

Item-- I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Odeon Twenty Five pounds and three shillings cash of this currency and one cow and one calf one wheel one chest one trunk one pewter dish one pewter Bason. Likewise I give and bequeath unto my two daughters Mary and Elizabeth Odeon my horse called Spark four bags of feathers two pewter candlesticks my heavers Loom and all the gear belonging thereto to be equally divided between them both in full of their possession and no more.

Item-- I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife Patience Odeon the service of my negro man called Sandor during her natural life and after her death to return to my son William Odeon and his heirs forever. Likewise I give and bequeath unto my wife Patience Odeon Twenty pounds cash of this currency and one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever

Item-- I give and bequeath unto my son William Odeon my plantation I now live on to him and his heirs forever. Likewise I give unto my son William Odeon all the rest of my Estate both indoors and outdoors to him and his heirs forever for the care and charge of his Mother during her Natural life and for the Downmanizing of this my last Will and Testament I do nominate constitute and appoint my son William Odeon my hole and sole Executor In witness I have hereunto sett my hand and Seal this 29th of Decembe 1743.
