

# NEWS FROM DEERING LAKE | April 2024



Well, we did get ice on the lake this winter, but not consistent enough to run the "ice-out" contest this year. Here's the view of Zoski on March 24- resulting in several days of power outages. More snow is on its way this week...

## **NEWS from the LAKE:**

• Flocks of migrating waterfowl came through while there was still significant ice- the common mergansers are staying for a while; the North Cove male loon arrived a few days ago. NH Lakes and the Loon Preservation Committee presented an interesting program <u>Surviving the Cold: An Inside Look at Loons in Winter</u> – you can watch from this link.

• Glenn reported "ice out" to the state as March 8. He explained that he confers with Henry Bozek and Pete Williams to determine the date -- the measure is when there is open water allowing a boat to travel from the island parking lot off Lake Shore to the dam. Glenn further noted this is the earliest he has ever seen the boards installed at the dam. With all the melting and run-off, the lake is fairly full already. FYI- "Ice out" in 2023 was April 11.

• Now that unusual weather patterns are becoming more of the norm, varying lake levels could be a greater concern for a variety of environmental issues. This <u>article</u> spells out some potential problems for all of us to consider. The Deering Conservation Commission is researching chloride levels in streams and wells this year; Gary Samuels will present the ConComm project at our May meeting.

• Elizabeth Lanier has been hired as the 2024 Lake Host program coordinator after serving as a Deering Lake Host the past two years. We have 2 lake hosts returning and Elizabeth is in the process of hiring a third.

# **NEWS from and for LAKE FOLKS:**

• The next ROADSIDE CLEANUP will be held on Saturday, May, 4 leaving at 9am from the town hall. Plan to arrive early to get a vest and to be assigned a team. We (the DLIA) do about 2 miles along Deering Center Road; it usually takes about an hour. Hope to see you there-remember your gloves and bug spray! Thanks to Glenn and Carole Clark for running this service 3 times every year.

• This has been another busy legislative session in Concord. The NH Lakes organization (which DLIA members support through annual donations), advocates for laws and policies that affect our lake quality and safety. Priority lake-related bills can be tracked for the NH House and Senate <u>here</u>. Core issues continue to be Aquatic Invasive Species and Management (supporting Lake Host initiatives among others); Polluted Run-off Water (Deering Conservation Commission targeted concern in 2024); Shoreland and Wetland Protection. <u>NH Lakes</u> offers a variety of email news updates to keep you informed.

• Mark your calendars: the 2024 Lakes Conference is scheduled for Friday, June 6 in Meredith. The 2024 theme is <u>"Communities Working Together for Resilient Lakes</u>"—this is a topic that is particularly important this year with the work the Deering Conservation Commission is doing towards water quality. It's a bit early to register, but it does fill up quickly.

• **Deering is Celebrating its 250<sup>th</sup>!** Keep your calendars open for the weekend of July 19-21 this is the official weekend for all the celebratory events. We don't have a full schedule as of this writing, but included in the festivities is a barbeque, and a concert by Tom Rush at the airport. Stay tuned for more info!

• The Schoolhouse/Library will reopen on May 18, with Saturday hours from 10-1pm. There will be many free programs including a talk on antique silver; bird photography; a biodiversity talk/walk; program on gems and minerals; learning to paint outdoors.
