NEWS from the LAKE:

- So far so good for the next generation of loons on Deering Lake. Both the North Cove and Campbell Cove pairs have one chick this year fingers crossed they'll make it to migrate this fall. Come to the DLIA meeting on Saturday, July 13 at 9am to get Glenn's full report. If you'd like to understand more of the various calls our loons make, take a listen here: Calls of the Loons— we figure an eagle is in the vicinity when you hear the yodel (and interestingly, only the male makes that call).
- As many of you know, cyanobacteria blooms are becoming much more prevalent on NH lakes. Jen
 Battistello reports that the small outbreak from last year is gone, but no lake is immune from future
 blooms. If you see what may be a bloom, please report it asap, noting that homeowners need to give
 the state permission to test for a bloom. NHDES Fact Sheet on Cyanobacteria will help you with
 identification and reporting.
- Residents around Deering have been getting their well water tested. If you would like more information and to get a 20% discount for Deering, please contact Granite State Analytical at 800-699-9920 (and request the Deering discount). The result are not released to anyone but the homeowner.

Greetings from Charlie and Elizabeth Hambrick-Stowe at the little green cabin near the end of Zoski Road. While it's not outfitted for winter, this is our "permanent residence," as we live here from sometime in April through October (in winter we are in Dover, DE). We also have the very vertical Loon Alley place on Ellsworth for when family and friends arrive, and for the afternoon sun on the dock.

By way of personal background, before retirement Charlie had a career in Christian ministry, teaching and publishing as a historian, and academic administration. Elizabeth is also an ordained minister and an attorney, with many years of practice as a lawyer.

It was in 1965 that the Stowe family first experienced the lake, when Elizabeth's father was a speaker at the Deering Conference Center. From then on, summer vacation was devoted to this special spot. Until it closed, the family stayed in Conference Center cabins, with every day—all day—spent at "the Point" across from Split Rock. Charlie's first summer was not until 1976, but he was immediately hooked and has been here every summer since. From the beginning, with Elizabeth's parents Dave and Virginia and our children after they came along, Deering was always an intergenerational treasure.

Elizabeth's sister Nancy and husband Tom Inui owned the house known as Hilltop from 1992 to 2015, so that property on Reservoir Road became Stowe family headquarters for those decades. They continue to visit the lake at least every few summers, as does Elizabeth's brother Dave and his grown kids and their families. Her sister Priscilla Hoffman-Stowe and husband Art are also on the lake, with a cabin on Uncle Barnes Road where the next generation continues to vacation.

Our three children—Anne, Tom, and Chuck—grew up with our vacation month at Deering as a highlight of the year. Now our grandchildren are enjoying the same experience. It does our heart good to know that the Deering saga continues into the future, as this summer we celebrate a full 60 years of our family on Deering Lake.


