The second area, soil health is really multi-faceted. On the one hand we need good soil health for optimum production with sustainability but the other thing is that other people are demanding to know what we as growers are doing about it! This gives it a marketing angle not before seen in the industry.

With that being said, we will be keeping an eye on your data, news on input pricing and supply chain, and planning for the future both immediate and longer term.
