Happy month of August to you all. I hope as you read this month's newsletter that it finds you well, healthy, and filled with God's blessings. In case you missed the announcement at church, the council members have decided to update a few of the sound equipment items and I will share why this decision was made and what benefits it will bring to the sanctuary.

First, the main speakers hanging up in the front of the sanctuary will be moved to the back and new speakers will replace them. This will help with the sound quality and clarity not only in the front of the building but also in the back. The speakers we currently have in the back of the sanctuary are not meant to fill up a space that big. Since I know most of you like to sit in the back pews anyway, you might as well have much better sound quality back there. I am only kidding, but also during weddings and funerals when people have to fill up the back of the church, they will be able to hear clearly as if they were sitting right up front.

Next, there will be four new outlets installed for musicians to plug their instruments in. The soundboard we currently have has four empty channels that can be used for other instruments to be plugged in, so we want to take advantage of the equipment we have. This will be extremely beneficial for the times we host community services and the other churches in town bring their worship teams to play. Not only will we be able to plug in more instruments with the new outlets, but we will also be placing new speakers on the floor so the musicians can hear their instruments as well. When I play my guitar, I am unable to hear what I am actually playing and trusting God that it sounds okay for all of you. The speakers on the floor will help the piano player, guitar player, or other musicians hear what is being played and improve the quality of the songs.

Lastly, we are having a camera set up to record our services. During the pandemic when many of the congregation is still being cautious and staying home during Sunday worship, those people can still feel part of the service by watching a live recording. The other benefit of this camera will be to send a live feed to the tv we have set up downstairs so on those occasions when the sanctuary is full and people need to sit in the basement, they will be able to see and hear exactly what is going on upstairs. This will also come in handy when we can start having our pancake breakfasts again and the people can watch and listen to the service as they prepare pancakes.

So those are the updates the council would like to see happen, but like anything that deals with sound equipment, it is not cheap. The total cost of this project will be around \$6,000 to complete. If this project seems like a good investment to you to see the worship ministry grow at First Lutheran, then we would love your support financially to see this project get done. Just make sure you mark on your offering envelope that that money goes towards the new sound equipment.

Thank you all so much, from the bottom of my heart, for all the generous giving during these last few months. Even though most of our governmental leaders view church as a non-essential business, you all knew how essential church really is, and you supported it through these difficult times. So thank you so much again. I love our church family and am so blessed I get to raise my daughter here, in this place called Pillager, surrounded by such loving and caring people. 
