2020 is now just a distant memory and we can look forward to what 2021 has in store for all of us. January seemed to fly by with its warmer than usual weather. I could get used to winters if that was the worst they would get. But here we are now in the month of February and as I am writing this newsletter article, Pillager is in a winter weather advisory because of the arctic temperatures that are passing through. I do not know why it seems like this kind of weather catches us off guard because we go through it every year. I felt like if January was that mild then maybe, just maybe, we can get through a winter season with pretty mild temperatures. But no. It would not be a typical Minnesota winter without -50 degree windchill.

But as I think about Ash Wednesday and the Lenten Season, I try to compare that to Minnesota winters. Maybe, just maybe, this season of Lent will be different. I will get the ashes put on my forehead and God will move in my life in a way I never thought possible. But we get the ashes, we attend the Wednesday services, and maybe we even give up one of our vices for Lent, but nothing seems to change. It is just another typical time of Lent. Just like the winters here, we cling to a hope that perhaps things will be different. Most of the time things never change and we get caught in a rut. We repeat the same habits year after year expecting something new to happen.

So how can we prevent ourselves from falling into a rut? The answer to that all depends on what we decide is valuable in our lives. Is growing in my relationship with God important to me? Or perhaps growing in your relationship with your spouse or kids? A lot of us say those things are important in our lives, but we rarely want to put in the time and effort it takes to grow in those areas. We need to evaluate what we find valuable and make a plan of action.

That's what I want us to do during Lent this year. Pick something in your life that you value. Let us use our relationship with God as an example (I hope you value your relationship with God). But if you truly value God, I want you to do something during the season leading up to Easter. I want you to treat your relationship with God like it is valuable. If we value our car, we put gas in it, get oil changes, wash it when it gets dirty. If we value our spouse we will spend time with them, buy them gifts, help them out around the house. So if we value God, what ways can we show that we do indeed value the relationship? Maybe that means spending time reading the Bible. Perhaps that means attending Sunday services. Or it could mean devoting five or ten minutes before bed spending time in prayer.

There are many ways we can spend time in trying to grow our relationship with God, and that is what the Lenten Season is all about. As we reflect on the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness, we too can spend the next forty days focusing on the Lord. Let our minds and our actions reflect just how much we value our time with God. And hopefully once we get through Easter, we will realize what a great investment it was spending forty days with Jesus. We will value it so much we will want to continue building our relationships for months, years and decades to come.

I do not help my wife to wash, spread or fold clothes, because the clothes are also mine and my children. I am not a help at home, I am part of the house. And as for praising, I asked my friend when it was the last time after his wife finished cleaning the house, washing clothes, changing bed sheets, bathing her children, cooking, organizing, etc. You said thank you But a thank you of the type: Wow, sweetheart !!! You are fantastic!!! Does that seem absurd to you? Are you looking strange? When you, once in a lifetime, cleaned the floor, you expected in the least, a prize of excellence with great glory ... why? You never thought about that, my friend? Maybe because for you, the macho culture has shown that everything is her job. Perhaps you have been taught that all this must be done without having to move a finger? Then praise her as you wanted to be praised, in the same way, with the same intensity.
