Now here is the challenge I want to extend to all those who consider First Lutheran to be their home church. I know there are a lot of prayer warriors out there, so I would like to see some of them step up and lead the congregation in prayer focusing on these four topics. Just like people who volunteer to read the Scripture lessons, can we get one person a week to volunteer to pray during the Sunday worship service? James 5:16 says the prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. And if getting up in front of a bunch of people to pray is not your cup of tea, will you commit to praying during the week? Jesus also mentions in Matthew 6:6 about praying secretly in our rooms. Maybe that is more of your style of praying. Either way, let's try and incorporate prayer into our lives this year that is centered around this community. Then let us sit back and watch what big things God does through those prayers. Jesus, let Your Kingdom come in this small town, and may Your will be done in Pillager, as it is in heaven. Amen.

JANUARY COUNCIL MINUTES

Opening and Call to Order: 6:35 PM on January 10, 2023

Present: Tom Kavanaugh, Tammie Barnett, Lynda Converse, Shirley Smith, Nicole Buersken, Julie Hofius, Dan Jacobson, Pastor Matthew Sundquist, Kirstie Sundquist, and Connie Vieths. Absent: Mike Bellos, Diane Wright.

Office Elections: The following were elected by council into the three office positions: Dan Jacobson as president, Julie Hofius as vice president, and Nicole Buersken as secretary. Pastor's Report: Christmas Eve service went really well with good feedback. Updates on communication with congregation members who are/have been sick. Noted that his six-month review is coming up this month and Dan Jacobson, Tom Kavanaugh, and Connie Vieths will be conducting the review.

Treasurer's Report: Tammie gave a recap of the treasurer's report. There are currently 25 keys and five more keys need to be made. Julie made a motion to have more keys made. She noted the church parking lot plowing is \$120 per time so \$600 total by the end of December. We want to be sure that the walks are also being shoveled each time. The LCMC contribution check was cut—our first one and the intention is to make this an annual contribution. Tammie has been the church treasurer for 13 years! Shirley made the motion to accept the report and Julie seconded; motion passed 5-0.

Approval of Agenda and Secretary's Report: Tom gave his final report for the council. Lynda made the motion to accept and Nicole seconded; motion passed 5-0.

Committees: Dan condensed the committees listed on the agenda to avoid redundancies and assigned a council member to each one to serve as the point of contact and to ensure tasks/issues in each committee are being resolved.

Worship/Music: Dan said Wendy is wondering whether the Holden Evening Service program should be used again for Lent. After discussion it was agreed that the program would be used again for 2023. Dan asked Pastor Matthew if long-term plans should be made for music services. Pastor said he would like to see more representation during services from the choir and Julie said the intention is to have choir sing on Palm Sunday and Easter. Pastor proposed that perhaps choir members would like to do solos/duets/trios on some Sundays.

Congregation and Community Outreach: Dan proposed finding out if there's a way to buy the Pillager School community mailing list so the church can use it for community outreach so we can start sending out mailers for VBS, game night, Bible study, and special services. Bob Harmsen left the postcards for ideas with Julie and she and Lynda will work on this. A meeting time will likely need to be held so anyone who would like to get involved can help design the mailers.

Hospitality: Connie is going to look at getting thank you cards, one of which is going to be given to Julie Warren for all her work done running the Sunday School Christmas program. Dan wanted to thank everyone involved in setting up for Irene's funeral because he received feedback that it was done very well. He also proposed that a list be put together for hospitality events and tasks. Funeral meals, pancake breakfasts, church dinner—do things need to be managed or assigned differently? Would Diane like to take this on?

Sanctuary: Nothing to report.

Facilities/Building: Dan found a \$60 sign light for the church sign and the intention will be to install it in the spring. Steve Roberts will be providing materials quotes for the church's siding and roof. Pastor Matthew received the quote for the new commercial sprayer faucet to be installed next to the dishwasher: \$385 for the faucet and \$275 for the installation so \$660 total. Julie made the motion to accept the quote and Shirley seconded; motion passed 5-0. The needed washer and dryer for the parsonage were approved by council and Pastor Matthew will submit the receipts. Robert Buersken is almost finished with the parsonage flooring renovation/door installations. Pastor Matthew will let Robert know when the last bifold door to install is available at Menards and Robert will install that along with the trim around an exterior door. Pastor Matthew and Kirstie are still having issues figuring out the exterior lighting for the parsonage; it was proposed that JoAnn's son Jeff could possibly come look at it when he's available. Dan will reach out to him regarding this.

Staffing: Dan said Connie is interested in keeping several of the church secretary duties but there are some duties she no longer wants. He would like to find someone who can help share these duties. He would also like to sit down with Kirstie and find out which duties she is no longer interested in and fill those gaps. Kirstie said she is considering getting her master's degree and if she decides to pursue the degree she would no longer be available on Sundays. Some member names from the congregation were brought up as potential people who could take on these duties.

Missions: The next meeting will be February 6th at 6:30 PM.

Old Business: Shirley brought up that it looked like the last newsletter had been copied from the previous one and discussion was held about having someone (or perhaps even a couple people) act as copy editors to check church mailers, newsletters, bulletins, church service PowerPoint slides, etc. Pastor Matthew said the MediaShout plus membership was purchased on the church credit card for the backing tracks and system similar to PowerPoint and the backing tracks are also available for use by the choir.

New Business: Dan proposed that the council pull together committee goals to keep everything on track for 2023. The February church council meeting was rescheduled for Monday, February 20 th due to Pastor Matthew and some council members being unavailable for the usual second Tuesday meeting time.
