



JULY AND AUGUST NEWSLETTER OF FIRST LUTHERAN MAY, 2022


The votes have been tallied and the results are in. Many people in the congregation have voiced their opinion on what day and time of the week there should be a Bible study. The majority of the votes landed on Wednesday evenings. So this got me thinking: What if there was a Wednesday night service at First Lutheran that could incorporate a Bible study? Then God laid it on my heart to start exactly that. This fall, as a way to kick off back to school, the church will be kicking off our Wednesday night contemporary service. This will be a night starting with a time of singing a few worship songs that one might hear on the radio station followed by a short devotional that ties into what we will be studying. After that, it will be open to small group discussions. Much of the learning and growing we do as Christians comes from sharing life with those who also live in the Kingdom of God.

I understand that this is only in the trial run phase and will have to be tweaked as time goes on, especially during Lent. It would be easy to transition from our contemporary service into our Lenten service since it will be on the same day and at the same time. The other transition will be our confirmation classes. Instead of the kids coming to listen to me for an hour or so once a week, boring them with church history or memorizing creeds, they can come and be a part of a service where they can learn about God's Word through small group discussions. Then if the kids show that they have been faithful attenders for a couple years, I will discuss with them if they want to go through the confirmation process.

Here is my goal by doing all of this: I first and foremost want all who attend to connect with God in a way they may not have connected before. I want people to grow in the knowledge of knowing Christ and what it means to be in relationship with Him and others. I want people to learn from each other, wrestle with questions, pray for one another, and encourage each other in their faith journey. I want people to grow and understand this wonderful book that the church holds so near and dear.

So that is the plan. A Wednesday night contemporary service that will include worship, Bible study, and fellowship. Stay tuned for more updates on when it starts, what time, and what book of the Bible will be studied first. I look forward to what God will do through this and I welcome any ideas regarding this service from any of my brothers and sisters in Christ. May all who are reading this be blessed abundantly.

Pastor's Report: Pastor has pretty much officially graduated (Congratulations!!) with just 1 more credit to finish up this summer. He will have his ordination in the fall in would seem (October??). Pastor will attend the LCMC gathering October 3-5 in Lakeville, MN and we will be looking for 1-2 people to join and attend as well. Discussed starting a Bible study with a Morning option (perhaps Tuesdays at 11) and a possible evening study as well, we even discussed new ideas for this such as House Church session or a Wednesday evening service.

Treasurer's Report: Building Maintenance account is already building and now we will start putting into the Missions account as well. Tom made a motion to accept and Julie seconded. Motion passed 7-0

Thursday October 16, 1958 - Tuesday July 19, 2022


First Lutheran would like to extend their condolences to the Gene Pilgrim family. Our thoughts and prayers are with you.
