FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH MEETING MINUTES

Opening and Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 6:30 p.m., Tuesday May 14, 2024.

Present: Pastor Matthew Sundquist, Julie Hofius, Dan Jacobson, Shirley Smith, Griff Eisel, Diane Wright, Nicole Buersken. **Absent:** Lynda Converse (Connie)

Opening Prayer: Pastor Matt

Pastor's Report: First communion was held on May 5 and received positive feedback from the congregation. Participants made their own chalice and helped served communion. Graduation Sunday will feature two graduates, Carter Gustason and Anthony Doucette. Pastor is considering holding a new member class and will make an announcement in May to see how much interest there is. Reported a few visits with Ken Kelling and would like to start bringing communion to Darlene Zabel. Pastor had 26 connections and 30 visits since the last council meeting. Treasurer's Report: Julie sent \$250 to Eagle's Nest from the coffee fellowship funds, and paid 779.40 to GoDaddy for 5 years of web hosting for the church's website. The building fund received \$3050 from donors. Motion to approve the report made by Dan and seconded by Nicole, before being approved by unanimous consent.

Secretary's Report: Council reviewed the minutes from the April meeting. Motion to approve the minutes made by Nicole and seconded by Griff.

COMMITTEE UPDATES:

Worship/Music:

Congregation and Community Outreach: (Lynda)– Julie reported that more than 40 people attended the spring tea and that the work put into the event by Wendy Jacobson and other volunteers was appreciated.

Hospitality: (Diane)

Sanctuary: (Shirley) – Shirley asked whether the furniture in the office and music room could be moved to the basement. Council members will also look into the possibility of selling some of the furniture on the garage sale.

Facilities / Building: (Nicole) -

□ Sunday School staff were able to get more divider panels to use for sectioning off the Sunday School room downstairs.

□ Audio from the Sunday service has been successfully brought into the nursery using a phone app that connects to the AV system. There was discussion about getting a dedicated speaker for the nursery, either as a tablet or smart speaker. Council looking into available technology.

□ Building committee meeting update – Committee met on April 27 with six attendees. Marlene talked about the carnival fundraiser planned for August 17. The festival would feature bands, silent auction or raffle and a bake sale and games. The next meeting is planned for May 26 after church services.

□ Griff received new siding quotes from Steve Roberts at Randall Lumber for steel and LP siding. Griff will be reaching out to contractors to get new labor quotes and confirm they have worker's compensation insurance. The committee will need to decide on the type and color of siding as the planning progresses.

Staffing: (Nicole/Julie) – The council is continuing a search for a financial secretary, with Julie filling in during the vacancy. One potential candidate has not returned our messages as of the meeting. Julie called Quickbooks customer service and found out the license number for Quickbooks was under our former financial secretary's account. She will move forward with getting a separate license for the church by the end of May.

Missions:(Julie) – each month we are asking for donations in the narthex and have funds available for clothing. Committee is planning to participate in the family fun fest at the Pillager school and the Halloween outreach this fall. A fall dinner has been discussed, but no decisions have been made.

Old Business: Regarding renewing our insurance contract for the church and parsonage, Julie requested the current insurer Church Mutual rebid our renewal premium with a lower building limit of \$1.8 million for the church with a \$5k deductible and no blanket coverage. This was done to help reduce the proposed 40% increase to \$10,622 from the original quote of \$12,300, which had a \$2500 deductible and blanket coverage. In a follow up meeting, the council voted 5-2 to approve the revised quote, with Julie and Nicole voting against in favor of the original quote. The church will move forward paying the premium on a monthly basis and continue investigated insurance options for next year. A competing quote from Northstar insurance was received, but included only an 80 percent payout on claims with no roof coverage for the parsonage.

New Business: Pastor received a call from CTC letting us know we have codes for long distance on our phone. We will retain the codes if needed in the future to make calls on the church line.

Adjourn & Closing: Shirley made a motion to adjourn which was seconded by Nicole.

First Lutheran Church Pillager Meeting Minutes

Opening and Call to Order: 6:30 PM on June 11, 2024.

Present: Pastor Matthew Sundquist, Griff Eisel, Julie Hofius, Shirley Smith, Diane Wright, Lynda Converse, Nicole Buersken, Sherri Holm. **Absent:** Dan Jacobson, Connie Vieths.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Matthew reported that the third grade class from Pillager school made a big thank you card for the donation made to the school so the students could take field trips. The card will be put out for the congregation to view. He also said that a financial person from the LCMC reached out and is asking for the church's certification of good standing for its 501(3) non-profit filing.

Treasurer's Report: Julie Hofius reported notable items for the month: \$750 was paid for the church's annual QuickBooks license, \$335 was donated to the kitchen fund (benevolence fund) and \$150 of that has been used so far for a new coffee filter that was urgently needed, and a \$100 donation was given for the mission fund. A motion to accept the report was made by Nicole Buersken, seconded by Lynda Converse, and motion was accepted. Secretary's Report: Minutes from the May meeting were reviewed. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Shirley Smith, seconded by Griff Eisel, and motion was accepted.

COMMITTEE UPDATES

□ **Worship/Music:** Pastor Matthew said that Wendy Jacobson has given out card slips so the congregation can make song selections, and she will use these to plan music for during services.

□ **Church Community Communication Committee:** Lynda said they will be planning for a CCC meeting in September, date to be determined.

□ **Hospitality:** Diane Wright said that the donations for the garage sale will be accepted at the end of June and the sale will be 7 AM to 6 PM Thursday and Friday, July 11th and 12th . Help will be needed the Wednesday before to help set up. She also said the costumes have been completed for the parade, which will be the following day Saturday, July 13th. Volunteers will be needed to help decorate the float. Bob Harmsen will be pulling the trailer that will be used as the float. Rosie Harmsen has tons of beads that will be handed out during the parade.

□ **Sanctuary:** Nothing to report.

□ **Facilities/Building:** Shirley said that weed killer spray is needed for the weeds growing outside. Pastor Matthew said he thinks there is some in the parsonage/garage and will follow up with her on it. Lynda said the outside of the church is covered in cobwebs and will be making an announcement after church to ask for volunteers to help brush the siding clean. Griff reported that he's been working on pulling together the siding materials quote and labor installation quotes. Steve Roberts from Randall Building Supply gave him the materials quotes: \$21,174.20 for steel siding or \$22,381 for LP siding. Griff also said he's gotten labor quotes back from Richards' Siding: \$23,382 for steel, almost double that for LP. He's also gotten labor quotes from Evan VanVickle: \$36,500 for steel and \$42,500 for LP. He's waiting on a third quote from Triple B Builders.

□ **Staffing**: Still looking for a financial secretary. Nothing new to report.


□ **Missions:** Griff said, on behalf of Marliss Eisel, that the next missions meeting will be June 24th where they will be working to finalize the parade float plans. Donations are coming in for Operation Christmas Child, and that missions project will continue throughout the year with items needed being updated every month.

Old Business: Julie said the insurance renewal is underway and that she has made the first payment.

New Business: Pastor Matthew said the letters are no longer staying on the white sign out in front of the church and the flagpole that bent over last year needs to be dug up. He suggested a new sign with a case to protect it from the weather. He ask that everyone keep an eye out for a replacement. Sherri Holm came to the council meeting to ask that council send out a survey asking people for feedback ("What do you dislike? What do you like? What would you like to see changed?") as there are quite a few unhappy people and people have been leaving the church. Council agreed that it would be good to hear feedback and discussed sending out a paper survey and possibly doing an online option as well. Due to the large church events like the garage sale, parade, and Family FUNdraiser, they decided to send out the survey in September. Council reviewed the notes Marlene Lindeman had prepared for the

Family FUNdraiser for the church siding. Cindy Walgren will be looking for stuffed animals and small games to be used as game prizes. Two more grills and propane will be needed to grill hamburgers and brats. Nicole will be making an announcement after church asking for baskets/items to be donated for the raffle.

Adjournment: Shirley made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Nicole, and motion passed. Minutes respectfully submitted by Buersken, Vice President.





John Michael Gilronan, age 72, was pronounced deceased Wednesday, January 3, 2024 at his home in Pillager, Minnesota. He passed through natural causes and entered Eternity with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

John was born on April 24, 1951, to Michael Thom as Gilronan and Katherine Emma Floren Gilronan in Kerkhoven, Minnesota. He was raised in Alexandria, Minnesota, graduated from Jefferson High School in 1969, and then attended the University of Minnesota, Morris.

Highly skilled in the building trades, John could do it all – carpentry, woodworking, electrical work, and plumbing – and his talents brought a host of opportunities. He built fish-processing plants in Alaska, Samoa, and Central America, and he spent years doing artisan-quality home renovations in both the Pacific Northwest and Minnesota. He often took on projects for friends who needed help and was known for working tirelessly, staying at it until the job was completed. Generous with his gifts and his time, he was embraced and appreciated wherever he went.

John's travels gave him a wide lens on human experience. He read comprehensively and enjoyed talking about books, movies, and the ideas behind them. A lively conversationalist with a sly sense of humor, he was also a lover of music and a fine cook.

He spent his last years in Pillager, Minnesota, where he was a member of First Lutheran Church. He was preceded in death by his parents, Mike and Katherine, and his sister, Ann Marie Loose.


