First Lutheran Church Pillager Minutes

January 14, 2025

Call to Order: 6:30 p.m. by Interim President

Present: Pastor Matthew Sundquist, Griff Eisel, Chris Warren, Dan Jacobson, Shirley

Smith, Diane Wright, outgoing member Nicole Buersken

Absent: Bob Harmsen, Don Oslowski

Organizing Procedures: A motion was made to install the two newly elected council members for 2025. Diane made a motion to appoint Chris and Don to the council following their election in December, with a second from Griff. Officers were appointed for the coming year, with Shirley making a motion that Bob Harmsen serve as President, Griff as Vice President and Dan as Secretary. The motion was seconded by Chris and approved.

I. Opening Prayer: Pastor Matt

- **II. Treasurer's Report:** Lynn reported that the church finished 2024 ahead of where we were at in 2023 despite unbudgeted expenses for furnace replacement that put total spending at 103% of budget. Overall, income exceeded total expenses by \$24k...Dan made a motion to accept the Financial Report, seconded by Griff and approved.
- **III. Pastor's Report:** The Christmas season and services were well appreciated, according to reports from congregation members. Pastor was able to visit Ken Kelling after he got out of quarantine. He also reached out to Pat but was not able to find a time to meet. Total pastoral visits from the end of December through the first two weeks of January totaled 34. Pastor also shared a note from Sue Carlson thanking Pastor for the funeral services for family members and his support, and the family made a donation.
- **IV. Secretary's Report:** The minutes of the December meeting were submitted and Chris made a motion to accept which was seconded by Griff and approved.

V. Committee Updates:

- 1. Worship/Music: Wendy made a suggestion that we should laminate copies of the order of service and leave them in the pews for reference during the service. Connie is making out a list of the prayer focus and scripture readings ahead of time so the reader can do both during the reading.
- **2. Congregation and Community Outreach:** (Marliss) Missions and Community Outreach held a joint meeting on January 13 and came up with a calendar of events for the year which was submitted to council. Key events during the first half of the year include activities during Lent, a March food drive, the April tea event and May Day paper flower bouquets for seniors.
- 3. Hospitality: no update.
- **4. Sanctuary:** Shirley reported we have a bee/wasp problem in the church. Has been picking up a lot of wasps both dead and alive in the church. Chris volunteered to look into finding the entry point in the siding/roof/foundation.

5. Facilities / Building:

- **6. Staffing:** (Nicole) In response to a suggestion from Bob, Kirstie resigned her tech support position to be able to spend more time with her children. The council discussed finding a way to rewrite the job description to allow Kirstie to continue parts of the job that fit with her schedule. Dan was assigned to meet with Kirstie to revise the existing job description.
- **7. Missions:** Missions Committee events were captured on the CCC calendar. Old Business: Griff provided a list of supplemental business items that were still open from 2024. Of these items, most are being or have been addressed. Council requested Connie complete a test of the Connection app to alert members of any changes regarding services. Following up on a request from Lynn, the council approved the purchase of a laptop computer that will allow her to do most of the financial work from home. The budget was set at \$800 or less. (Dan followed up that he had found a Dell computer for \$750 and a purchase was made.)

New Business: Griff noted that we will set dates for a Pastoral Review twice a year. With pastor's contract up in June, negotiations will start this spring. The council agreed with Lynn that we should set a goal of completing a financial audit before the end of the first quarter.

Adjourn and Closing: Shirley made a motion to adjourn, which was second by Dianne and voted by email acclamation.

Third Annual Spring Tea


